## Key disclaimers to note

Since 2021, this SANDAG Mid-Year Crime Bulletin has utilized crime data from the California Incident Based Reporting System/National Incident Based Reporting System (CIBRS/NIBRS). The Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) NIBRS became the standard for law enforcement crime reporting in the United States on January 1, 2021. CIBRS is the California state version of NIBRS, which allows California law enforcement agencies to report their crime data directly to the California Department of Justice (CAL DOJ). San Diego County law enforcement agencies received CIBRS certification in 2022.

The crime statistics prior to 2021 utilized the Uniform Crime Reporting Summary Reporting System (UCR Summary). Therefore, data shown here should not be compared to UCR Summary data from any other sources due to different methods of counting offenses and/or crime cases. To access historical UCR Summary crime data for the San Diego region prior to 2021 please see the ARJIS or visit SANDAG's [Criminal Justice Clearinghouse](#).

Data for this publication were extracted as a snapshot of all regional CIBRS crime counts in November and December of 2025. Data are derived from the ARJIS Operational Storehouse and are subject to change as new information becomes available. Data derived directly from San Diego Police Department's records management system may differ slightly from data available to SANDAG through ARJIS; therefore, aggregate data in this bulletin cannot offer a direct comparison to statistics originating from within San Diego Police Department.

The San Diego Sheriff's Office (SDSO) is transitioning to a new Records Management System (RMS) to improve data accuracy and transmission. Due to this transition, SDSO data were extracted in two parts: one from ARJIS for years 2021, 2024, and for June 17–30, 2025; and the second was received directly from SDSO for January 1–June 16, 2025. Additionally, data derived directly from SDSO's records management system may differ slightly from data available to SANDAG through ARJIS; therefore, aggregate data in this bulletin cannot offer a direct comparison to statistics originating from within SDSO.

It should be noted that in 2021, Coronado Police Department, California State University San Marcos, San Diego State University, and the University of California San Diego did not provide data because they were not fully transitioned to CIBRS/NIBRS. As such, crime rates for 2021, along with 2021-2025 annual comparisons in the Appendix Tables are not presented for these agencies. Due to the small number of incidents these agencies had in 2024 and 2025, missing data do not have a significant effect on regional totals or rates.

Certain crime incident elements, such as cleared offenses and incidents flagged as domestic violence, are not available in this report. SANDAG is working to incorporate these analyses in the near future.

The CIBRS/NIBRS reporting system is a standardized data collection system designed to improve the reporting, collection, and analysis of crime data.

# Introduction

SANDAG has compiled and reported regional crime statistics for San Diego County since 1980 and remains the only local source for regional statistics not available at the national level. The compilation of these data over the past 46 years has relied on the support and cooperation of local law enforcement agencies and the Automated Regional Justice Information System (ARJIS). Their continued partnership is gratefully acknowledged.

In 2023, this publication transitioned to reporting crime data based on the California Incident Based Reporting System (CIBRS)/National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Developed by the FBI in the 1980s, NIBRS became the national standard for crime data reporting following a federally mandated implementation deadline in 2021.

CIBRS is California’s state-specific version of NIBRS, which allows California law enforcement agencies to report their crime data directly to California Department of Justice (CAL DOJ). In 2016, San Diego County law enforcement agencies began collaborating with ARJIS to implement the new reporting system and enhance the quality and scope of local crime data. They began submitting NIBRS data in 2021 and received CIBRS certification in 2022.

This 2025 Mid-Year Crime in the San Diego Region Bulletin presents Group A and Group B CIBRS/NIBRS annual data for 2021, 2024, and 2025, consisting of annualized crime rates per 1,000 residents,<sup>1</sup> along with the actual counts of crime incidents reported.<sup>2</sup>

Historically, these reports have included comparison data from the current year, the previous year, and five years prior. Since CIBRS/NIBRS data became available in 2021, this report uses one-year and four-year comparisons instead, thus excluding data from 2022 and 2023. This CIBRS/NIBRS data collection effort, extraction, and validation was supported by ARJIS staff and ARJIS member agencies.<sup>3</sup>

## Highlights

- The annualized **crimes against persons** mid-year rate of 9.41 per 1,000 residents was **3% lower** than in 2024, reflecting fewer non-consensual sex offenses (-9%), kidnapping/abductions (-8%), aggravated assaults (-6%), murders (-6%), and simple assaults (-2%). There was a 10% increase in intimidation offenses.
- The annualized **crimes against property** rate of 18.95 was **15% lower** than in 2024. There were decreases for almost all categories, including motor vehicle thefts (-30%), robberies (-28%), larceny thefts (-14%), and burglaries (-13%). There was an increase in arson incidents (40%) and stolen property offenses (2%).
- The **crimes against society** rate of 7.04 was **5% lower** than in 2024, reflecting decreases in all categories, including prostitution (-56%), weapons law violations (-11%), drug equipment violations (-6%), and drug narcotic violations (-2%).
- **Group B offenses/arrests** (which includes less serious crime categories) **increased by 12%** from 2024 to 2025.

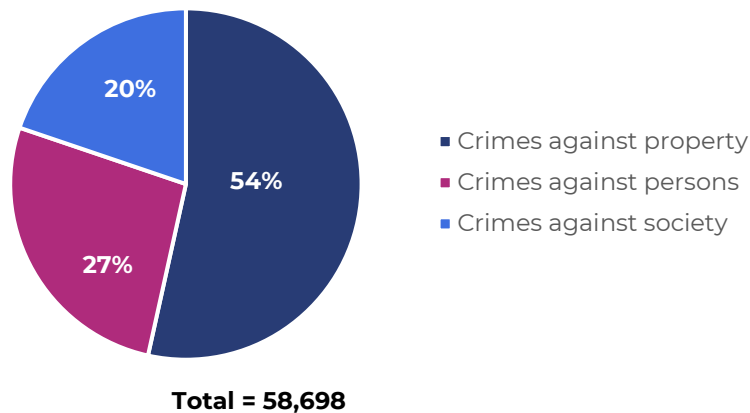

# Group A Offenses

## Overall crime

There were **58,698 CIBRS/NIBRS Group A offenses** reported to law enforcement in the San Diego region during the first half of 2025 (January 1 to June 30),<sup>4</sup> reflecting a 10% decrease from the same period in 2024 (65,426) and a 21% decrease from 2021 (74,757) (Appendix Table 1). Of those reported incidents, more than half (54%) were crimes against property, followed by crimes against persons (27%) and crimes against society (20%) (Figure 1).

**Figure 1: Group A Offenses by Crime Category in 2025**

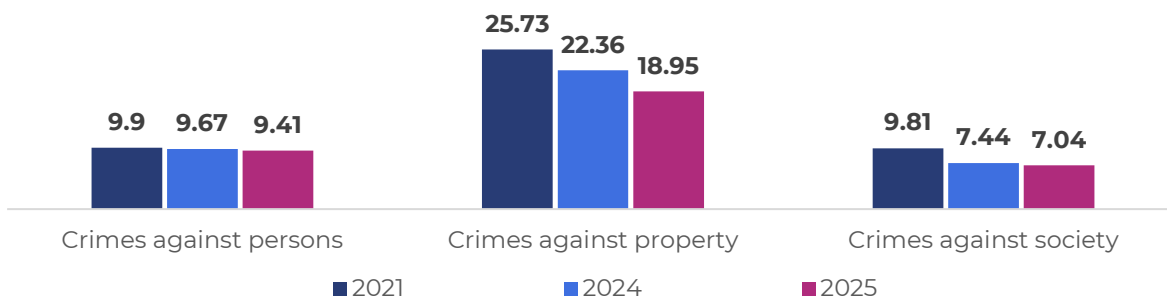

The 2025 mid-year annualized crime rate for Group A offenses in the region was **35.41 crimes per 1,000 residents** (Appendix Table 2).<sup>5</sup> All three crime categories saw decreases from the year prior, with crimes against property showing the largest decrease, dropping 15% from 2024 and 26% from 2021 (Figure 2). Crime against society rates fell by 5% from the previous year, and crimes against persons by 3%.

## Crimes against persons

Crimes against persons include 15 offenses: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, negligent manslaughter, justifiable homicide, rape, sodomy, sexual assault with object, fondling, aggravated assault, simple assault, intimidation, kidnapping/abduction, incest, statutory rape, human trafficking-commercial sex acts, and human trafficking-involuntary servitude.

According to CIBRS/NIBRS, **15,607 crimes against persons** incidents were reported to local law enforcement agencies in the region during 2025, representing decreases from both 2024 (-3%) and 2021 (-4%) (Appendix Tables 1 and 7).

Crimes against persons accounted for more than one in four (27%) total crimes reported during the first half of 2025 (Figure 1, Appendix Table 1). As expected, crime trends varied across jurisdictions in the region. Among the 16 jurisdictions with sufficient data for comparison, 11 had decreases from 2024 (ranging from -3% in El Cajon to -28% in Coronado) and five had increases (ranging from <1% in San Diego to 25% Santee) (Appendix Table 3).<sup>6</sup>

The most common crime against persons reported was simple assault—constituting over half (56%) of all incidents—followed by aggravated assault (28%), intimidation (8%), non-consensual sex offenses (5%), and kidnapping/abduction (2%) (Figure 3). Less than 1% of cases were classified as murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, negligent manslaughter, justifiable homicide, consensual sex offenses, and human trafficking (not shown). This distribution is similar to that of previous years.

In **crimes against persons**, one offense is counted per each victim. For instance, if a kidnapping incident involves three victims, three separate offenses are counted.

About **1 in 4** total incidents reported to law enforcement by 2025 were **crimes against persons**

## Variations in specific crimes against persons types

- There were 33 **murders and nonnegligent manslaughters** reported in the region in 2025, two less than the year prior (-6%) (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1). Among the incidents for which a motive could be determined, the most common were arguments (63%), domestic violence (21%), and gang involvement (11%).<sup>7</sup>
  - Murders and nonnegligent manslaughters most frequently took place on a residence (34%) or street/sidewalk (25%).
  - Of the 30 murders and nonnegligent manslaughters with a known weapon, the most common was a firearm (43%).
  - Of the 26 murders and nonnegligent manslaughters with a known victim-suspect relationship, the suspect was known by the victim in 17 incidents (65%).
- There were 4,440 **aggravated assaults** reported in 2025, down 6% from the year prior (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1). Among 15 comparable jurisdictions, 10 had decreases (ranging from <-1% in San Diego to -35% in San Marcos) and five had increases (ranging from 3% in Carlsbad and Chula Vista to 41% in Poway) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
  - Two-fifths (40%) of aggravated assaults involved the use of a personal weapon (e.g., hands, feet, arms, etc.), 24% an “other” weapon (e.g., brick, poison, vehicle), 15% a knife/cutting instrument, 12% a blunt object, and 8% a firearm (Table 2).<sup>8</sup>

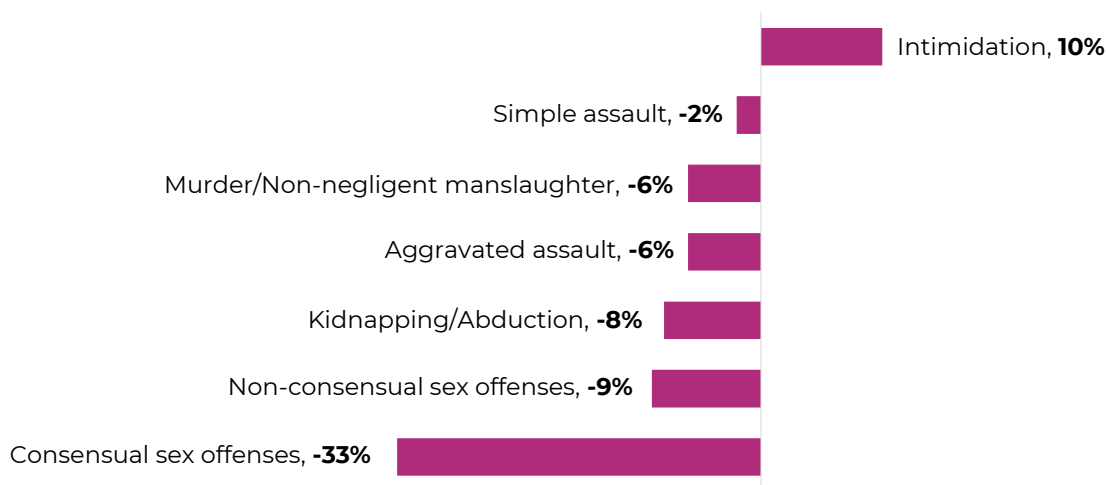
- **Simple assaults** fell by 2% from 8,857 incidents in 2024, to 8,717 in 2025 (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1). This figure includes all assaults and attempted assaults which are not aggravated in nature and do not result in serious injury. Among the 15 jurisdictions with sufficient data for comparison, 10 had decreases (ranging from -1% in San Diego to -35% in Poway), and five had increases (ranging from 2% in Oceanside to 34% in Santee) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).

- The 1,321 acts of **intimidation** reported in 2025 represented a 10% increase from the previous year (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1). Five of the eight jurisdictions with sufficient data for comparison saw increases (ranging from 14% in Escondido to 48% in El Cajon), while three saw decreases (ranging from -3% in Oceanside to -28% in National City) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
- Compared to 2024, **non-consensual sex offenses** (including rape, sodomy, sexual assault with an object, and fondling) reported to law enforcement fell by 9%, reaching 736 incidents by 2025 (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1). Among five jurisdictions with large enough counts for comparison in 2024 and 2025, three saw decreases (ranging from -10% in Oceanside to -32% in El Cajon), while two saw increases (<1% in San Diego and 9% in Chula Vista) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
  - Of the four crime categories under non-consensual sex offenses, two increased from the previous year: rape (9%) and sexual assaults with an object (12%). The other two decreased, including fondling (-18%) and sodomy (-13%) (Appendix Table 1).
- **Kidnapping/abduction** incidents fell 8% from 2024, reaching 322 incidents by 2025 (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1). The only two jurisdictions with sufficient data for comparison in 2024 and 2025 saw decreases, including San Diego (-9%) and Chula Vista (-26%) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
- **Consensual sex offenses** (including incest and statutory rape) reported to law enforcement fell by 33%, from 45 in 2024 to 30 in 2025 (Figure 4, Appendix Table 1).<sup>9</sup>

Crimes against persons saw less incidents in the first half of 2025 than in the first half of 2024. Nearly all categories within this crime type decreased, including kidnapping/abduction, simple and aggravated assaults, consensual and non-consensual sex offenses, and murder-nonnegligent manslaughter. Only incidents of intimidation increased.

## Crimes against property

Crimes against property include 25 offenses (robbery, burglary, eight types of larceny theft offenses, motor vehicle theft, arson, vandalism/destruction of property, counterfeiting/forgery, seven types of fraud offenses, embezzlement, extortion/blackmail, bribery, and stolen property).

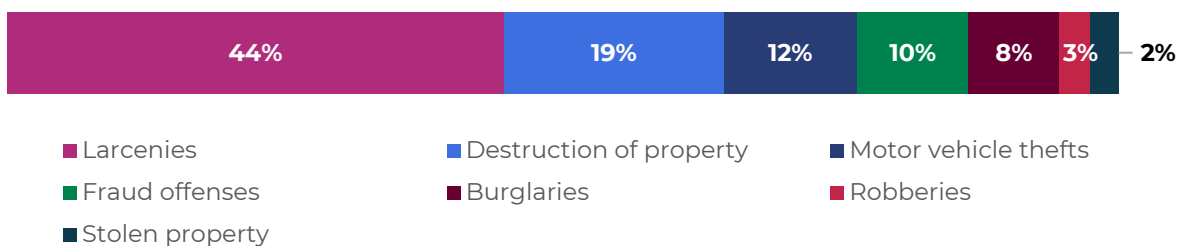
A total of **31,419 crimes against property** incidents were reported to regional law enforcement in 2025 (Appendix Tables 1 and 8), marking a 15% decrease from 2024 and a 26% decrease from 2021. Crimes against property incidents accounted for more than half (54%) of total crimes reported in 2025 (Figure 1 and Appendix Table 1). The annualized crimes against property rate was 18.95 per 1,000 residents (Figure 2 and Appendix Table 4).

**Over half (54%)** of all incidents reported to law enforcement in 2025 were **crimes against property**

Of the 17 jurisdictions with counts large enough for comparison in 2024 and 2025, almost all experienced decreases in crime against property rates (ranging from -5% in Lemon Grove to -39% in Coronado). Santee saw the only increase (13%) (Appendix Table 4).

The three most common reported incidents within crimes against property were larcenies (44%), acts of vandalism/destruction of property (19%), and motor vehicle thefts (12%) (Figure 5). Arson, counterfeiting, embezzlement, extortion, and bribery incidents collectively made up 2% (not shown).

### Varying trends in specific crime against property types

- Robberies** in the region decreased 28% to 857 in 2025 (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1). All jurisdictions with robbery numbers large enough for comparison in 2024 and 2025 experienced a decrease (ranging from -12% in Chula Vista to -51% in Escondido) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
  - Over half of robberies (56%) involved a personal weapon, 20% an “other” weapon, 11% a firearm, 8% a knife/cutting instrument, and 4% a blunt object (Table 3).<sup>10</sup>

- Burglaries** saw a decline of 13%, from 2,911 in 2024 to 2,523 in 2025 (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1). Among the 12 jurisdictions with burglary counts large enough for comparison in 2024 and 2025, eight experienced decreases (ranging from -8% in La Mesa to -51% in National City) and four experienced increases (ranging from 6% in Poway to 19% in Oceanside) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).

  - In 2025, two thirds (66%) of burglaries were categorized as forced entry, and 34% as no forced entry (not shown).
  - Of the 2,494 burglaries that had a known category at the time of this report, 56% were non-residential, and 44% residential. Compared to the previous year, non-residential and residential burglaries decreased by 5% and 21%, respectively.
- Motor vehicle thefts** saw a stark decrease of 30% in 2025, reaching 3,700 incidents (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1). All 12 jurisdictions with sufficient data for comparison saw decreases from 2024 (ranging from -3% in Santee to -55% in Vista) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).<sup>11</sup>

  - In 2025, almost all motor vehicle thefts were completed (99%) and only <1% were attempted (not shown).
- Arsons** increased by 40% from 2024, reaching 211 incidents (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1).<sup>12</sup>
- There were 6,083 **destruction of property** (vandalism) offenses reported in 2025, 13% lower than in 2024 (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1). Of the 14 comparable jurisdictions, 10 had decreases (ranging from -6% in Oceanside to -30% in San Marcos) and three had increases (ranging from 1% in Escondido to 7% in Chula Vista). Imperial Beach did not experience a change (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).

**Crimes against property** are typically counted as one offense for each distinct criminal act, regardless of how many victims or items are involved. An exception to this rule is motor vehicle theft (NIBRS Code 240), which is counted as one offense per stolen vehicle. For instance, if two vehicles are stolen during the same incident, it is counted as two separate motor vehicle theft offenses.

- **Stolen property offenses** increased by 2%, reaching 783 incidents in 2025 (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1).<sup>13</sup> Among the four jurisdictions with large enough counts for comparison, three saw decreases (ranging from -6% in San Diego to -53% in El Cajon), and only Chula Vista saw an increase (6%) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
- Larceny remained the most common crime in 2025, with 13,798 reported incidents in 2025, marking a 14% decrease from 2024 (Figure 6, Appendix Table 1). Across the region, 15 jurisdictions saw declines (ranging from -3% in Encinitas and Escondido to -33% in El Cajon). Only National City and Santee saw increases (10% and 14%, respectively) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
  - It is worth noting that in 2025, the San Diego region had a **shoplifting** increase of 18% from 2024 and 94% from 2021. Of 14 comparable jurisdictions, 9 experienced decreases (ranging from -6% in Santee to -43% in El Cajon) and 5 experienced increases (ranging from 1% in Escondido to 135% in National City) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).<sup>14</sup>

- The 3,079 **fraud** offenses reported in 2025 marked an 8% decrease from 2024 (Figure 6, Appendix Tables 1).<sup>16</sup> Across the region, 10 jurisdictions reported decreases (ranging from <-1% in San Diego to -47% in Encinitas) and two reported increases (11% in Vista and 14% in Escondido) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
  - Around two-fifths (38%) of fraud incidents in 2025 were categorized as impersonation, followed by identity theft (29%) (Table 5).

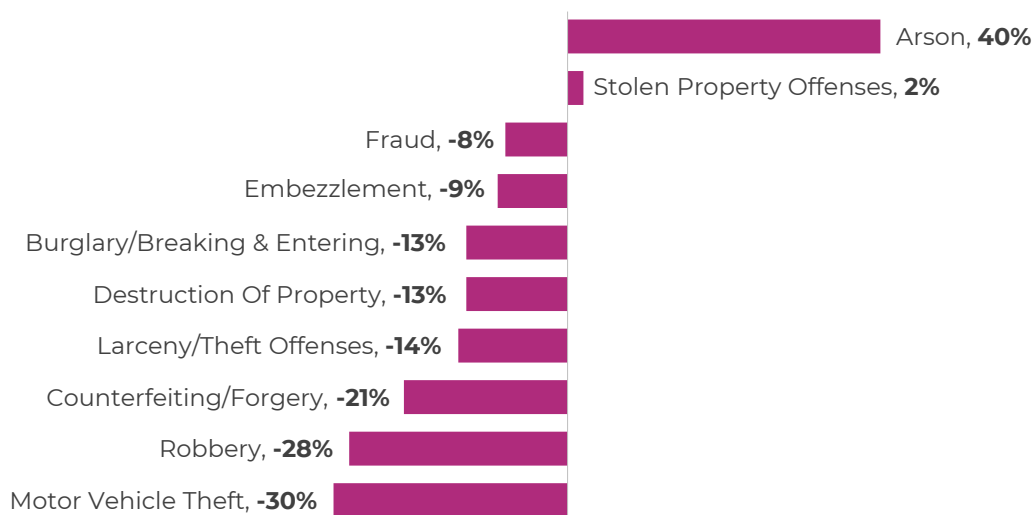

- Other crimes against property categories were lower in 2025 compared to 2024, including a 21% decrease in **counterfeiting/forgery** and 9% in **embezzlement** (Figure 6).<sup>17</sup>
- There were 31 incidents of **extortion/blackmail** in 2025 (Appendix Table 1).<sup>18</sup>

Nearly all property-related crimes in the region experienced a decrease from 2024, except for arson and stolen property offenses. Larcenies, the most frequently reported offense in this category, decreased in most of its subtypes; however, shoplifting increased by 18%.

## Crimes against society

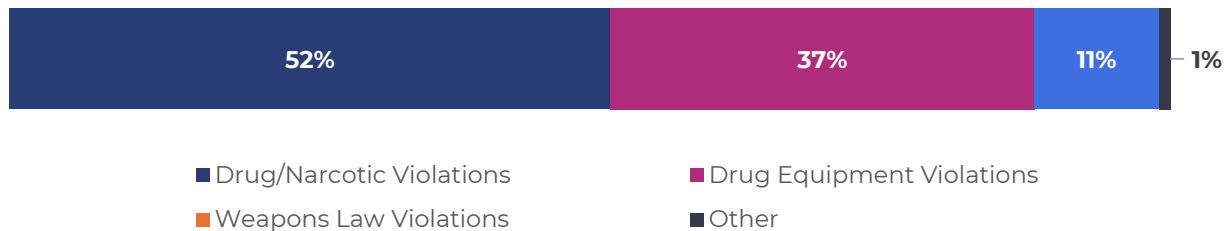
Crimes against society include 12 offense types (drug/narcotic violations, drug equipment violations, four gambling-related offenses, pornography/obscene material, prostitution,<sup>19</sup> weapon law violations, and animal cruelty).

In 2025, the region recorded an annualized rate of 7.04 crimes against society per 1,000 residents, a figure slightly below 2024 (7.44) and notably lower than in 2021 (9.81) (Figure 7 and Appendix Table 5). Law enforcement agencies reported a total of **11,672 crimes against society** in 2025, marking a 5% decrease from 2024 and a 28% decline from 2021 (Appendix Tables 1 and 9).

In 2025, **1 in 5 (20%)** crimes reported in the region were **crimes against society**

Of the reported crimes against society incidents, over half (52%) were drug/narcotic violations, 37% drug equipment violations, and 11% weapons law violations. Incidents of pornography/obscene material, prostitution, animal cruelty, and gambling cumulatively made up about 1% of crimes. Among the 15 comparable jurisdictions in 2024 and 2025, eight had lower crime against society rates (with decreases ranging from just <-1% in Chula Vista to -57% in Encinitas), while seven had higher rates (ranging from 1% in Carlsbad to 27% in Escondido) (Appendix Table 5).

### Variations in specific crime against society types

- There were 6,046 **drug/narcotic violations** reported in 2025, a 2% decrease from 2024 (Figure 8, Appendix Table 1). Among the 15 jurisdictions with counts large enough for comparison, nine saw decreases (ranging from -7% in Carlsbad and Oceanside to -59% in Encinitas), while six saw increases (ranging from 4% in Chula Vista to 35% in Escondido) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).

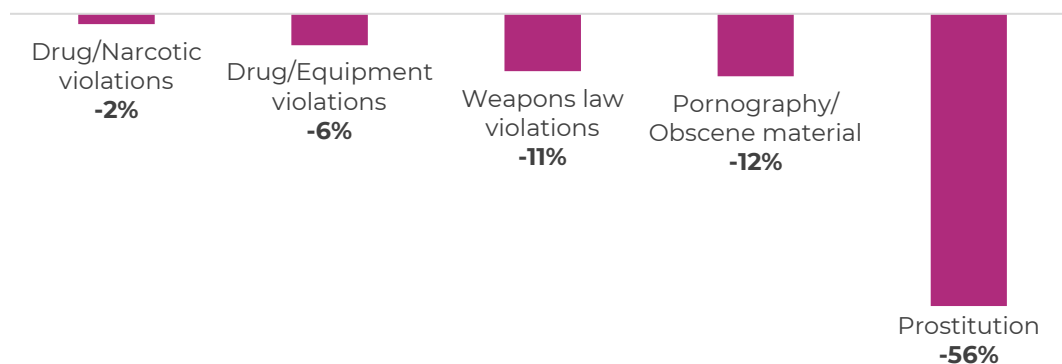

- **Drug equipment violations** decreased 6% compared to 2024, reaching 4,261 in 2025 (Figure 8, Appendix Table 1). For the 14 jurisdictions with drug equipment violation numbers large enough for comparison in 2024 and 2025, eight had decreases (ranging from -7% in Chula Vista to -65% in San Marcos), and seven had increases (ranging from 16% in Carlsbad to 133% in National City) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).
- There were 1,248 **weapons law violations** reported in 2025, 11% lower than in 2024 (Figure 8, Appendix Table 1).<sup>20</sup> For the eight jurisdictions with weapons law violations numbers large enough for comparison in 2024 and 2025, seven had decreases (ranging from -2% in Escondido to -41% in San Marcos), and only Vista had an increase (31%) (Appendix Tables 11A, 11B, 12A, 12B).

**Crimes against society** is a crime category that was not previously tracked under UCR Summary. Under this category, each distinct crime incident is counted as one offense.

- **Prostitution** crime incidents decreased 56% from 2024, reaching 73 reported incidents in 2025 (Figure 8, Appendix Table 1).<sup>21</sup>
- There were five fewer incidents of **pornography/obscene materials** in 2025 compared to 2024, from 42 to 37 (Figure 8, Appendix Table 1).

In 2025, all offense types within crimes against society saw a decrease compared to the previous year. Drug narcotic violations and drug equipment violations made up the majority of reported incidents and both saw decreases. Reported incidents of prostitution saw the largest decrease.

## Group A Offense Changes (2024–2025)

In 2025, the majority of comparable Group A offense categories decreased from the year prior, with the exception of three offenses (Table 6).

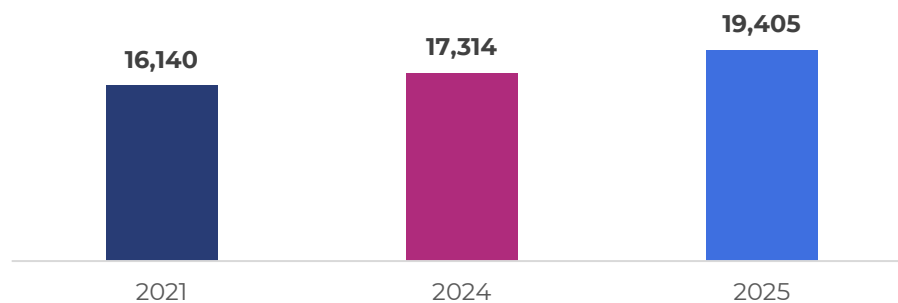

## Group B Offenses

Group B offenses include less serious crime categories such as curfew/loitering/vagrancy, disorderly conduct, driving under the influence (DUI), family offenses (nonviolent), liquor law violations, trespassing, and all other offenses. Law enforcement agencies must report both incidents (crime cases) and arrests for Group A offenses. However, Group B offenses are only reported if an arrest is made. Therefore, only Group B arrest reports include circumstances of the arrest and arrestee data (e.g., age, gender, race and ethnicity).

In 2025, there were **19,405 Group B offenses** in the San Diego region, marking a 12% increase from 2024 (17,314), and a 20% increase from 2021 (16,140) (Figure 9 and Appendix Table 13). All offenses under this category experienced increases from 2024, with the exception of disorderly conduct (-8%) (Appendix Table 13).

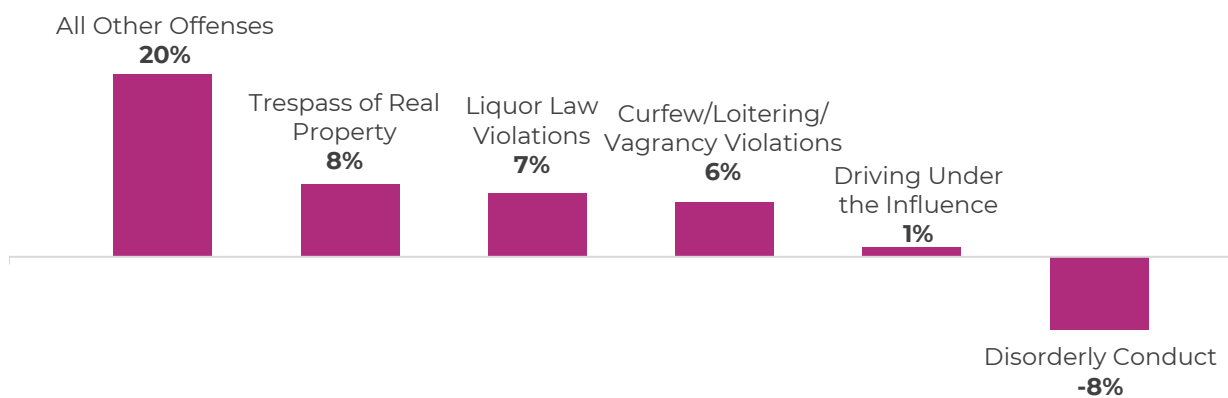
### Variations in specific Group B offenses

- There were 13,468 **all other offenses** reported during 2025, an increase of 20% from 2024 (Figure 10, Appendix Table 13).<sup>23</sup> All 14 jurisdictions with counts large enough for comparison saw increases (ranging from 4% in San Diego to 209% in Encinitas) (Appendix Tables 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B).
- **Curfew/loitering/vagrancy violations** increased 6% from 2024, reaching 339 reported incidents in 2025 (Figure 10, Appendix Table 13). Only two jurisdictions had large enough counts for comparison: El Cajon, which saw a 3% decrease, and San Diego, which experienced a 100% increase (Appendix Tables 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B).
- There were 2,726 **disorderly conduct** offenses reported in 2025, 8% lower than in 2024 (Figure 10, Appendix Table 13). Of the 13 comparable jurisdictions, nine had decreases (ranging from -3% in Santee to -47% in San Marcos) and four had increases (ranging from <1% in San Diego to 11% in La Mesa) (Appendix Tables 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B).

- Incidents of **driving under the influence** increased 1% in 2025, reaching 2,398 incidents (Figure 10, Appendix Table 13). Of 14 jurisdictions with counts large enough for comparison, 11 had decreases (ranging from -1% in Chula Vista and Escondido to -35% in Encinitas), and three had increases (ranging from 18% in San Diego to 85% in Poway) (Appendix Tables 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B).
- **Liquor law violations** increased 7% to 110 incidents in 2025 (Figure 10, Appendix Table 13).<sup>24</sup>
- **Trespass of real property** incidents increased by 8%, reaching 362 counts in 2025 (Figure 10, Appendix Table 13). San Diego was the only jurisdiction with large enough counts for comparison, with a 7% increase from the year prior (Appendix Tables 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B).
- There were two incidents of a **family offense (nonviolent)** in 2025 (Appendix Table 13), which was one more than the one reported in 2024 (Appendix Tables 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B).<sup>25</sup>

## Hate Crimes

As part of the California Penal Code (PC), the Attorney General is required to submit an annual report to the Legislature regarding crimes motivated by a victim’s race/ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, or physical or mental disability. According to the California PC, a hate crime is a criminal act committed in whole or in part because of the actual or perceived characteristics of the victim. Thus, hate crimes are not separate, distinct crimes, but rather traditional offenses specifically motivated by the offender’s bias.

Since 2008, local law enforcement agencies have shared the hate crime reports they submit to the state directly with SANDAG, allowing access to more detailed than what is available in

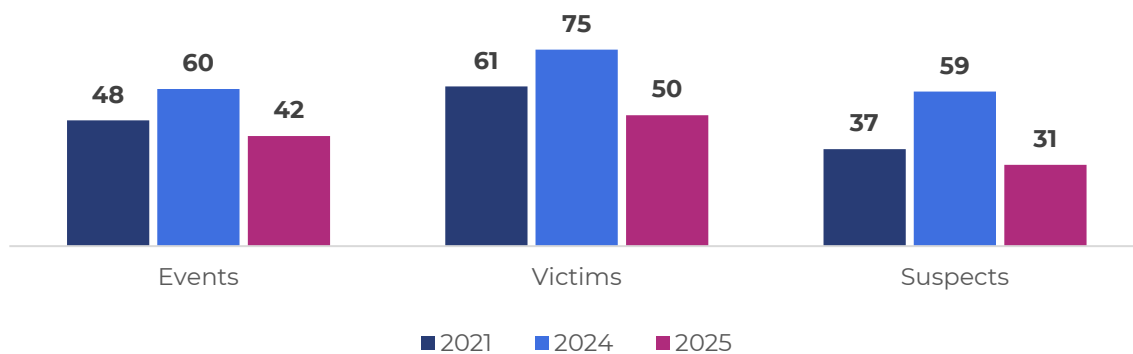

region reported a total of **42 hate crime events**, involving 50 victims and 31 known suspects (Figure 11).<sup>26</sup>

Compared to 2024, the number of hate crime events fell by 30%, down from 60. Hate crimes were reported by Police Departments in Carlsbad, Chula Vista, La Mesa, National City, Oceanside, San Diego, San Diego Sheriff's Department ( Encinitas, Unincorporated areas, and Sheriff Other), California State University San Marcos, San Diego State University, and University of California San Diego (not shown).

Additional key findings from the compiled hate-crime data include:

- Of the 46 documented offenses (one event may account for multiple offenses):
  - Nearly three-fifths (58%) were described as crimes against property. These consisted of 23 incidents of destruction or damaging of property in some way (e.g., vandalism) and one robbery.
  - Over two-fifths (42%) were crimes against persons. This included seven aggravated and simple assaults (each respectively) and five incidents of intimidation.
- Of the 42 events where a victim description was available, 62% involved an individual or multiple individuals; 22% involved a religious organization; and 8% involved a government entity or a business (each respectively).
- Of the 31 victims whose gender was documented, 68% were male.
- Of the 42 events where location was noted, 29% occurred at a church, synagogue, temple or mosque; 17% at a parking lot or garage; 12% at a residence, home, or driveway; 10% at a school, college, or university; 10% at a business; 7% on a highway, road, alley, street; or sidewalk; 7% at another or unknown location; 5% in an outdoor area; 2% at a government building; and 2% at a jail, penitentiary, or correctional facility.

- Of the 42 hate crime events, 45% were motivated by race, ethnicity, or national origin; 36% by religion; 14% by sexual orientation; and 5% by gender identity.
- Of the 15 incidents related to the victim's actual or perceived religion, almost half (47%) of the bias motivations were described as being anti-Jewish, 20% anti-Catholic, 20% anti-other religion, and 13% anti-Islamic.
- Of the 19 incidents related to the victim's actual or perceived race, ethnicity, or national origin, 53% of the bias motivations were described as being anti-Black, 21% anti-Hispanic, 11% anti-Asian, and 5% anti-Other, anti-multiple races, and anti-White (each respectively).

## Understanding the different crime reporting systems

### Uniform Crime Reporting Summary Reporting System (UCR Summary)

The Uniform Crime Reporting Summary Reporting System (UCR Summary) was used and maintained nationally by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) since the 1920s. The UCR Summary had two specific classification categories: Part I offenses consisting of 8 crimes (e.g., murder, rape, aggravated assault, robbery, burglary, larceny theft, motor vehicle theft and arson) and Part II offenses consisting of 21 crimes (e.g., simple assault, fraud, vandalism, drug offenses, and driving under the influence).

While the UCR Summary provided valuable crime data for many years, it also had several limitations. Under this system, only the most serious offense or highest charge associated with each incident was reported. For instance, if an individual broke into a vehicle, committed a simple assault, and subsequently committed a rape, only the rape offense would be recorded, as it represents the most severe crime in that scenario.

The UCR Summary focused on a limited number of crimes, potentially overlooking important details and emerging trends. For instance, it only recorded the attempted or completed status for a limited number of crime types. Additionally, information on weapon involvement was collected exclusively for certain offenses, such as homicide, robbery, and aggravated assault. Lastly, it only collected aggregate counts, meaning it did not capture detailed information about the context of crimes, characteristics of the victims and offenders, relationships, or other circumstances related to the crime.

### National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS)

The National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is a federal incident-based reporting system for law enforcement agencies to report crime cases and arrests to the United States Department of Justice (US-DOJ).

First created in the 1980s, NIBRS collects detailed data on all offenses that occur within a single incident, rather than only the most serious offense. NIBRS also collects more comprehensive information about each crime, including multiple offenses within the same incident. For instance, an incident involving rape, motor vehicle theft, and kidnapping would have each offense reported separately. Law enforcement agencies are required to report each offense as a separate and distinct crime, not as part of another. Additionally, they must provide specific details such as the date and time of the offense, location, victim and offender demographics, and the relationships between the individuals involved.

NIBRS has two specific crime categories known as Group A and Group B offenses. Group A offenses include 52 serious crimes (e.g., murder, rape, robbery, and burglary). Group B offenses include 8 offenses that tend to be less serious in nature (e.g., disorderly conduct, curfew/loitering/vagrancy, drunkenness, and trespassing).

NIBRS became the standard for law enforcement crime reporting in the United States on January 1, 2021. In order to comply with the FBI mandated NIBRS reporting deadline, San Diego County law enforcement agencies began cooperating with the Automated Regional Justice Information System (ARJIS) in 2016 to implement the new system and improve the quality and breadth of local crime data.

## California Incident Based Reporting System (CIBRS)

The California Incident-Based Reporting System (CIBRS) is California's state-specific version of NIBRS, designed to capture additional data values that are of interest to the state. This system allows agencies to transmit their NIBRS data to the California Department of Justice (CA-DOJ), which then forwards the data to the United States Department of Justice (US-DOJ), to ensure compliance with national NIBRS reporting standards. San Diego County law enforcement agencies became CIBRS-compliant in 2022, one year after beginning their NIBRS data reporting efforts.

### How do CIBRS and NIBRS differ?

While NIBRS and CIBRS share the same foundational structure and both adhere to federal reporting standards, CIBRS is designed to capture all standard NIBRS data elements while incorporating additional data fields that address California's unique priorities. NIBRS is a national system that is used by law enforcement agencies across the United States with extra categories exclusive to federal and tribal law enforcement agencies (e.g., immigration violations, and fugitive offenses).

### How do CIBRS/NIBRS compare to UCR Summary?

CIBRS and NIBRS are built on an incident-based reporting framework designed to capture more comprehensive, accurate, and detailed information about each crime event. This shift allows for better analysis of crime trends and the circumstances surrounding each offense. In order to better understand the differences between CIBRS/NIBRS and UCR Summary, the following table compares key elements of both crime reporting systems. It is important to remember that due to different methodologies on how crimes are counted and categorized, crime statistics should not be compared between both systems.

## CIBRS/NIBRS Group A offenses are counted

### Definition of an Incident

The FBI defines an incident as one or more offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time and place. In most circumstances, think of each crime case as one incident.

### Definition of an Offense

Offenses are the specific crimes that occur within each incident. Agencies can report up to 10 Group A offenses within a particular incident. For example, an incident can include the offenses of rape, motor vehicle theft, and kidnapping/abduction. Each crime case can include multiple CIBRS/NIBRS offenses.

**Crimes Against Persons:** One offense is counted per victim. For example, if an aggravated assault involves two victims, it is recorded as two aggravated assaults.

**Crimes Against Property:** One offense is generally counted for each distinct operation of crime, with the exception of motor vehicle theft (NIBRS Code 240), which is counted as one offense per stolen vehicle. For example, if one location is robbed, only one count of robbery is recorded regardless of the number of victims or items robbed. Conversely, if two cars are stolen, two counts of motor vehicle theft are reported.

**Crimes Against Society:** One offense is counted for each distinct operation of crime.

## How CIBRS/NIBRS Group B offenses are counted

### Definition of a Group B Offense

Group B offenses tend to be minor in nature, such as curfew/loitering/vagrancy violations, disorderly conduct, driving under the influence, etc. and are only reported when an arrest occurs. The Group B Arrest Report describes only the circumstances of the arrest, the Group B arrest offense, and the arrestee data (e.g., his/her age, sex, race, and ethnicity). Reporting agencies are required to submit a separate Group B Arrest Report for each arrestee involved in the incident.

**Group B Offense:** One offense is counted per arrest.

For more information on offense counting and classification criteria, please see the FBI's [2025 NIBRS User Manual](#), as the criteria vary for crimes against persons, crimes against property, and crimes against society.
