2004 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM:
AMENDMENT NOS. 15 AND 16

File Number 4000600

Introduction

SANDAG, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), is responsible for the adoption of a biennial Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP), a five-year program of major transportation projects in the San Diego region. The 2004 RTIP, which covers the fiscal years from 2005 through 2009, must conform to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for air quality. Conformity to the SIP means that transportation activities in the 2004 RTIP will not create new air quality violations, worsen existing violations, or delay the attainment of the national ambient air quality standards. The SANDAG Board adopted the 2004 RTIP including the emissions analysis at its meeting on July 23, 2004, and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) jointly approved the 2004 RTIP on October 4, 2004.

Recommendation

The Transportation Committee is asked to take the following actions:

1. adopt Resolution No. 2006-17 (Attachment 1), approving 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 15; and
2. accept the Draft 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 16 (Attachment 3), including its air quality conformity analysis and conformity redetermination for the 2030 RTP: 2006 Update, for distribution and public comment.

SANDAG processes amendments generally on a quarterly basis and occasionally on a more frequent basis as unforeseen circumstances arise. This report includes two amendments: (1) Amendment No. 15 is the quarterly amendment which includes requests for changes submitted by local agencies for various projects; and (2) Amendment No. 16 includes the addition of capacity-increasing projects, which has prompted a new regional emissions analysis for air quality conformity purposes.

Discussion

Quarterly Amendment: Amendment No. 15

The project changes proposed in Amendment No. 15 are shown below. Table 1 (Attachment 2) provides additional details for the projects being amended.

Caltrans

Go California Lump Sum Projects (CAL001): Go California, part of the Governor's Strategic Growth Plan, represents a ten-year mobility action plan. This component of the action plan is one element of the larger Go California project. The balance of the proposed Go California programming was

identified as part of a proposed statewide infrastructure bond measure. As a precursor to the larger program, nine statewide Go California workshops were held between September 28 and October 26, 2005, identifying short-term strategies and projects that would bring congestion relief that can be constructed and opened to traffic over the next 6 to 18 months. Approximately 32 projects were selected and are expected to be funded through the State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP). This program of projects is designed to be implemented as soon as possible and achieve measurable congestion relief on some of the most heavily traveled sections of the California highway system. Out of 32 projects in the state, 11 are in San Diego County.

Seven of these projects are considered exempt for purposes of air quality; that is, there is no impact to the region's air quality and as such they can be grouped together as one project. The other four projects are capacity increasing, or because these projects would increase traffic flow, SANDAG is required to run a new emissions analysis. These projects are included with Amendment No. 16 (discussed below) to allow for additional public review and consultation.

The seven exempt projects include: (1) additional Secure Electronic Network for Travelers Rapid Inspection (SENTRI) lane at the San Ysidro Port of Entry (POE); (2) additional FAST lane at the inspection station at the Otay Mesa POE; (3) interchange modification on Interstate 5 (I-5) at 28th Street; (4) improve I-5 northbound exit at Via De La Valle; (5) install radar scanner at various locations on I-5, State Route (SR) 52, SR 94, and I-805; (6) add storage and channelization on I-8 Second Street off-ramp in El Cajon; and (7) widen single lane exit ramp to two lanes 240 meters beyond the gore point from southbound I-805 to Telegraph Canyon Road. Since these projects are exempt for purposes of air quality conformity, they are shown as a single lump sum project. These fully funded Go California lump sum projects total \$17,154,000 in SHOPP funds.

I-15 Managed Lanes-Middle (CAL18): Exchange \$23,100,000 in Traffic Congestion Relief Program (TCRP) funds from I-15 BRT (SAN26) project with like amount of *TransNet*-Major Corridors (MC) funds in order to take advantage of TCRP availability this year. SAN26 is still in design and is not ready to expend TCRP funds as quickly as CAL18, which is under construction. In addition, show use of *TransNet*-Major Corridors funding, identified as *TransNet*-MC Advanced Construction (AC), to advance project award in FY 2006. Future federal High Priority earmark funds are anticipated from FY 2007 through FY 2009 to be credited back to the project. Federal programming guidelines require full funding at time of contract award. Total project remains \$426,847,000.

As part of the approval for the *TransNet* Early Action Program (EAP) and the *TransNet* Plan of Finance (POF), the Board approved commitment of 85 percent of state and federal transportation funds available to the region toward the EAP projects. Those funds include the State Transportation Improvement Program-Regional Improvement Program (STIP-RIP), Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP), and Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ). The changes to the three projects below (CAL18A, CAL18B, and CAL26) reflect the programming of these regional funds.

I-15 Managed Lanes-North Segment (CAL18A): Add CMAQ, RSTP, and *TransNet*-MC funds in order to fully fund this project consistent with the December 2005 Board approved *TransNet* POF. Total project programming increases to \$180,646,000. Of this amount, \$115,041,000 in *TransNet*-MC AC funding is programmed to advance project delivery in anticipation of future federal funds (CMAQ and RSTP) which will be credited back from FY 2009 through FY 2011. Since this RTIP cycle runs through FY 2009, the remaining credit is not shown on the attached table but will be included with the 2006 RTIP biennial update.

I-15 Managed Lanes-South Segment (CAL18B): Adds \$26,350,000 in CMAQ funds and reduces like amount of *TransNet-MC* funds. Total program for preliminary engineering (PE) phase remains \$62,000,000.

SR 52 Freeway (CAL26): Increases *TransNet-MC* and RSTP funds increasing the total programmed for this project to \$424,837,000. Of this amount, \$78,331,000 in *TransNet-MC* AC funding is programmed to advance project delivery with anticipated future federal funds (High Priority, RSTP) to be credited back in FY 2009. As part of the 2006 STIP process, SANDAG anticipates adding \$22 million in STIP-RIP funds to fully fund this project. The California Transportation Commission (CTC) is scheduled to take action on the 2006 STIP at its April 27, 2006, meeting. Until then, the 2006 STIP funding will be included with the 2006 RTIP biennial update. Upon approval of the STIP funds, this project will be fully funded.

Highway Bridge Repair and Replacement [HBRR] (CAL44): The state has increased the funding for this program. Total project increases to \$73,756,000.

City of Imperial Beach

Ream Field (IB04): Transfer funds from and delete SR 75 Landscape (IB01) project to this new project that would improve the intersection at the entrance to Ream Field. Total project is \$163,000 in *TransNet-Local* (L) funds.

North County Transit District (NCTD)

Rail ROW Improvements (NCTD18): Amendment No. 14 to the 2004 RTIP inadvertently reduced prior year *TransNet- Transit* (T) funds. This amendment restores those funds that were already paid out to NCTD. Total project increases to \$10,016,000 from Amendment No. 14.

San Diego Association of Governments

Regional Rideshare Program (SAN11): Add funds received from the Air Pollution Control District. Total project increases to \$30,865,000.

Mid-Coast Corridor (SAN23): Adds Federal Transit Administration (FTA) FY 2006 earmark funds. Total project programming increases to \$56,822,000.

I-15 BRT (SAN26): Adds FTA FY 2006 earmark funds and exchanges TCRP funds with *TransNet-MC* (see CAL18 above). Total project increases to \$119,156,000.

Bus/Rail Rolling Stock (SAN32): This project was transferred from SANDAG to be implemented by the Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) [(MTS28)] as part of the overall Capital Improvement Program approved by the Board on February 24, 2006. This amendment deletes this project. The MTS addition was included in 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 14.

Bus Station Stops and Terminals (SAN33): This project was transferred from SANDAG to be implemented by the MTS (MTS29) as part of the overall Capital Improvement Program approved by the Board on February 24, 2006. This amendment deletes this project. The MTS addition was included in 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 14.

Bus/Rail Preventive Maintenance (SAN37): This project was transferred from SANDAG to be implemented by the MTS (MTS32) as part of the overall Capital Improvement Program approved by the Board on February 24, 2006. This amendment deletes this project. The MTS addition was included in 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 14.

East County Bus Maintenance Facility (SAN52): Adds FTA FY 2006 earmarks. This carryover project from the 2002 RTIP increases to \$14,190,000.

County of San Diego

Bradley Avenue Overpass at SR 67 (CNTY21): Revises the project limits; there is no change to funding. Total project remains \$1,132,000.

Valley Center Road Bridge (CNTY22): Revises HBRR funding based on latest update. Total project increases to \$11,768,000.

Street Improvements (CNTS26): Increases *TransNet-L* funds. Total project increases to \$8,600,000.

San Diego Metropolitan Transit System

Bus/Rail Rolling Stock (MTS28): Breaks out the *TransNet-T* funds, which were originally included with local funds. Total project remains \$8,800,000.

Bus/Rail Support Equipment and Facilities (MTS30): Breaks out the *TransNet-T* funds, which were originally included with local funds. Total project remains \$14,225,000.

City of San Diego

University Avenue Mobility project (SD129): This new project would improve the University Avenue transit corridor in North Park. Total project of \$15,000 is funded with *TransNet-L*.

Skyline Drive (SD130): This new project consists of landscaped median, street trees, pedestrian improvements and street lights along Skyline Drive. Total project of \$15,000 is funded with *TransNet-L*.

SR 15 Bikeway (SD14): Reduces funding and scope. The City has agreed to complete this project through its environmental phase. Total project is reduced to \$810,000.

Georgia Street Bridge/University Avenue (SD38): Transfers the HBRR funds to CAL44. In order to maintain flexibility with the HBRR lump sum program, Caltrans has requested the HBRR funds remain with the lump sum project. The required local match remains with this project. Total project is reduced to \$2,916,000.

W. Mission Bay Bridge (SD70): Increase HBRR funds based on latest update from Caltrans. Total project increases to \$78,191,000.

U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs

Indian Reservation Roads Program (BIA01): Increases funding based on latest update from the FHWA. Total project increases to \$8,063,000.

Air Quality Analysis

On July 23, 2004, SANDAG found the 2004 RTIP in conformance with the Regional Air Quality Strategy/ State Implementation Plan (RAQS/SIP) for the San Diego region. All of the required regionally significant capacity increasing projects were included in the quantitative emissions analysis conducted for the 2004 RTIP, as amended.

Projects in Amendment No. 15 meet the conformity provisions of 40 CFR 93.122(g). All capacity increasing projects in Amendment No. 15 were included in previous regional emission analysis of the 2030 RTP and 2004 RTIP, as amended (SANDAG Board approval March 28, 2003, U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) approval April 9, 2003). All other projects are either noncapacity increasing or are exempt from the requirement to determine conformity according to §93.126 of the Transportation Conformity Rule. SANDAG followed interagency consultation procedures to determine which projects are exempt. Amendment No. 15 does not interfere with the timely implementation of Transportation Control Measures (TCMs). The 2004 RTIP, including Amendment No. 15, remains in conformance with the SIP.

Amendment No. 16: Draft Air Quality Conformity Analysis

Federal metropolitan planning and air quality regulations prescribe the process for determining air quality conformity. These regulations require that the RTIP: (1) provide for the timely implementation of TCMs; (2) include a quantitative emissions analysis of projects programmed in the RTIP, including all regionally-significant projects; and (3) meet the applicable emissions budgets (targets) and interim emissions tests for the 8-Hour Ozone and the Carbon Monoxide standards.

The 2004 RTIP programs substantial funds for the implementation of the four TCMs (identified as "T-tactics") adopted in the 1982 RAQS/1982 SIP for air quality improvement. The four TCMs/T-tactics are ridesharing, transit improvements, traffic flow improvements, and bicycle facilities and programs. The TCMs/T-tactic projects programmed for implementation total approximately \$1.9 billion, or about 31.5 percent of the total funds programmed in the 2004 RTIP. The addition of the capacity increasing projects does not impact the timely implementation of TCMs.

A quantitative air quality emissions analysis was conducted for the years 2002, 2009, 2010, 2014, 2020, and 2030 revenue-constrained transportation scenarios. The results of this analysis are included in the attached draft report being distributed for public comment. This draft report is scheduled to be reviewed by the San Diego Region Conformity Working Group (CWG) and with the Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee (ITOC) at their respective meetings on April 19, 2006. The CWG is the interagency consultation group made up of various transportation and air quality agencies including the San Diego Air Pollution Control District, Caltrans, California Air Resources Board, the U.S. DOT, and the U.S. Environment Protection Agency. The ITOC is the independent citizen oversight committee that reviews *TransNet* funded projects.

Based on the analysis, the 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 16 meets the conditions for determining conformity with the applicable SIP for air quality. This amendment reflects new projects and changes to existing projects which are described below.

Independent Taxpayer Oversight Committee (ITOC)

At its meeting on April 19, 2006, the ITOC is scheduled to review both amendments focusing on the EAP and other *TransNet* funded projects. Any comments from the ITOC will be provided to the Transportation Committee at the April 21, 2006, meeting.

Projects in Amendment No. 16

Below describes the projects proposed for changes as part of Amendment No. 16. The attached 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 16 (Attachment 3), provides additional details for the projects being amended.

Caltrans

I-5 HOV Managed Lanes (CAL09): This amendment proposes to divide this project in order to implement certain ready-to-go segments (see CAL09A and CAL09B below). The current program of \$31,165,000 funds the PE phase which includes the environmental document.

I-5 Lomas Santa Fe Interchange/HOV Lanes (CAL09A): This project, which has been split from CAL09, would construct the interchange and HOV lanes to San Elijo. In order to fully fund this project, \$18,177,000 of RSTP funding was added and *TransNet*-MC was reduced by \$21,901,000. Total project is \$56,290,000.

I-5 Auxiliary Lanes [Go California (CAL09B)]: As reported as part of Amendment No. 15, Go California represents a ten-year mobility action plan funded through the SHOPP, designed to be implemented as soon as possible and achieve measurable congestion relief on some of the most heavily traveled sections of the California highway system. This project constructs north and southbound auxiliary lanes between Via De La Valle to Lomas Santa Fe Drive. Total project is \$11,520,000.

SR 52 Managed Lanes/HOV (CAL26A): This amendment proposes to divide this project in order to implement certain ready-to-go segments (see CAL26B and CAL26C below). The current program of \$28,000,000 funds the PE phase which includes the environmental document.

SR 52 Auxiliary Lanes (CAL26B): This project, which has been split from CAL26A, would construct east and westbound auxiliary lanes from the SR 52/I-15 separation to Mast Boulevard. A total of \$2,800,000 of *TransNet*-MC funding is added for a total project of \$43,200,000.

SR 52 Truck Lane [Go California (CAL26C)]: This project, which is split from CAL26A, would add \$6,100,000 of *TransNet*-MC and \$2,000,000 of SHOPP funding to extend the westbound truck lane from Santo Road to Oak Canyon Bridge to facilitate traffic flow. Total project is \$8,100,000.

SR 905 New Freeway (CAL38): Revises the project description to be consistent with a Caltrans request to the FHWA for an environmental re-evaluation of the project. Also adds \$3.1 million in

local funds from the City of San Diego. Total programmed increases \$234,235,000. Local AC funding totaling \$4,800,000 is programmed to advance project delivery with anticipated future federal High Priority funds to be credited back in FY 2008 and FY 2009. This amount reflects a *TransNet* loan from SANDAG to this project in case the federal funds do not materialize when needed. This project was approved for design sequencing, which allows construction to begin prior to completion of all right-of-way acquisition.

SR 54 HOV Restripe [Go California (CAL81)]: This project restripes the HOV lanes to integrate it with the existing mixed flow lanes. Total project is \$265,000.

HOV Bypass to SR 94/SR 125 Connector [Go California (CAL82)]: This project adds an HOV bypass to minimize SR 94 westbound queuing. Total project is \$10,143,000.

City of Escondido

Centre City Parkway (ESC24): This carryover project from the 1998 RTIP would widen Centre City Parkway from four to six lanes. Total project is \$1,728,000.

Citracado/Nordahl (ESC25): This carryover project from 1998 RTIP would widen Country Club to SR 78 from four to six lanes. Total project is \$2,649,000.

San Dieguito River Park

Lake Hodges Bicycle/Pedestrian Bridge (SDRP04): This new project would improve the connection for bicyclists and pedestrians between Escondido, Poway, and Rancho Bernardo. At the March 24, 2006, meeting, the Board approved additional Transportation Enhancements (TE) funding for this project. Total project is \$7 million.

Various Agencies

Smart Growth Incentive Program (V04): Transfers \$2 million in FY 2006 TE funds in order to fund the Lake Hodges project (SDRP04) above. Total project is reduced to \$15,287,000.

APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 15 TO THE 2004 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2004, SANDAG adopted the 2004 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) and found the 2004 RTIP in conformance with the 1998 Regional Air Quality Strategy (RAQS) and the 2002 Ozone Maintenance Plan; and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2003, SANDAG made a finding of conformity of the 2030 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) with the State Implementation Plan (SIP) and the 1998 RAQS; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation issued its conformity finding to the 2030 RTP on April 9, 2003; and

WHEREAS, on April 22, 2005, SANDAG made a finding of conformity of the 2030 RTP and 2004 RTIP, as amended, to the 8-hour ozone standard; and

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2005, the U.S. Department of Transportation issued its conformity finding of the 2030 RTP and 2004 RTIP, as amended, to the 8-hour ozone standard; and

WHEREAS, agencies have requested project revisions for inclusion into the 2004 RTIP as shown in Table 1; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the 2030 RTP; and

WHEREAS, the regionally significant capacity increasing projects have been incorporated into the quantitative air quality emissions analysis and conformity findings conducted for the 2030 RTP and the 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 15; and

WHEREAS, projects in Amendment No. 15 satisfy the transportation conformity provisions of 40 CFR 93.122(g) and all applicable transportation planning requirements per 23 CFR Part 450; and

WHEREAS, the 2004 RTIP Amendment No. 15 relies on the previous regional emissions analysis; and

WHEREAS, all other projects in Amendment No. 15 are either noncapacity increasing or exempt from the requirements to determine conformity; and

WHEREAS, the SANDAG Board of Directors delegated the authority for RTIP amendments, including findings of air quality conformity, to the Transportation Committee; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED that the Transportation Committee does hereby approve the attached Table 1 as Amendment No. 15 to the 2004 Regional Transportation Improvement Program; NOW THEREFORE

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that SANDAG finds the 2004 RTIP, including Amendment No. 15 in conformance with the SIP and RAQS for the San Diego region, is consistent with SANDAG Intergovernmental Review Procedures, and is consistent with SANDAG Public Participation Policy, as amended.
