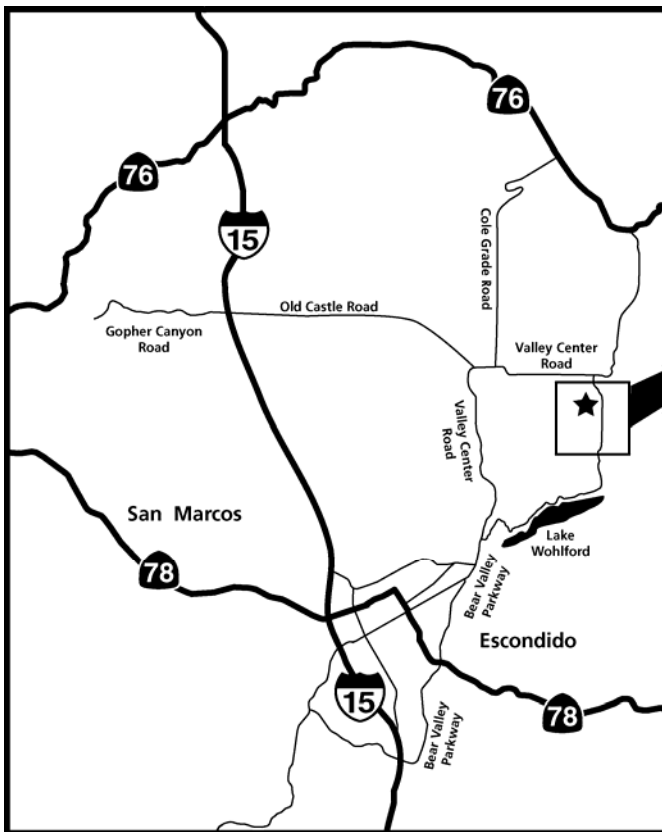
From the North

OLD CASTLE RD. becomes LILAC RD.
Turn LEFT onto VALLEY CENTER/CR S6
Turn RIGHT ONTO N. LAKE WOHLFORD RD.

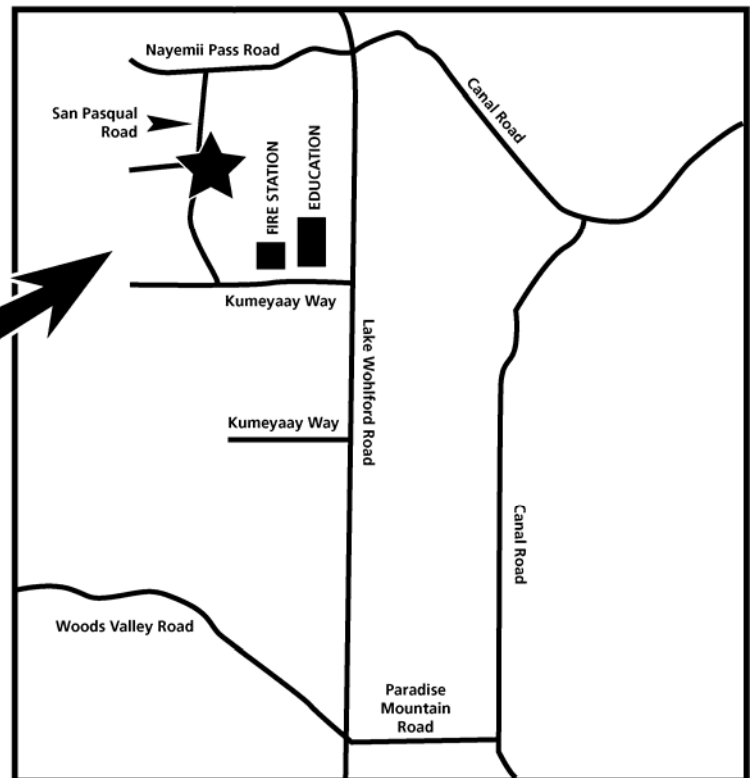
From the South

Take I-15 North
Exit VIA RANCHO PARKWAY
Turn RIGHT onto E VIA RANCHO PARKWAY
E VIA RANCHO PARKWAY becomes BEAR VALLEY PKWY S.
Turn RIGHT onto E VALLEY PKWY/CR S6
Turn RIGHT onto LAKE WOHLFORD RD.

Go West onto Kumeyaay Way

4.	2010 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (Elisa Arias, SANDAG)	INFORMATION
	SANDAG, serving as the San Diego region's metropolitan planning organization (MPO), is required by state and federal law to develop and adopt a Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP). The RTIP is a multiyear program of proposed major highway, arterial, transit, and non-motorized projects. Any project funded with federal transportation funds are required to be included in the RTIP. The current 2008 RTIP expires December 15, 2010, the draft 2010 RTIP covers the period FY 2011 to FY 2015. The draft RTIP will be presented to the Transportation Committee on July 16. At its July 23 meeting, the SANDAG Board of Directors will be asked to release the draft RTIP for public comment for a 30-day period.

Chairman Devers and Renée Wasmund will report out on the 2010 San Diego Regional Tribal Summit held April 9, 2010, and discuss the next steps in pursuing a collaborative action agenda based on the policy direction provided at the summit by both the SCTCA and SANDAG Boards. The Working Group is asked to review the recommended next steps and provide feedback.

SANDAG staff provided an update on the development of the 2050 RTP performance measures and sought input from the SCTCA at its May 18, 2010, meeting held in Escondido. At its June 18, 2010, meeting, the Transportation Committee recommended that the Board of Directors approve the 2050 RTP performance measures at a future meeting. Staff proposes that the 2050 RTP performance measures incorporate two tribal corridors within the travel time in key travel corridors/communities indicator. Staff requests that the Tribal TWG provide input to facilitate the selection of the two tribal corridors.

- +11. DEVELOPMENT OF THE INITIAL UNCONSTRAINED TRANSPORTATION NETWORK (Carolina Gregor and Heather Werdick, SANDAG)

DISCUSSION

Based on feedback received from SANDAG working groups and the public, policy advisory committees, and the Board of Directors, staff has assembled initial recommendations for a preferred 2050 transit network based on the initial three alternatives evaluated as part of the Urban Area Transit Strategy. This transit network, combined with highway improvements, and other management strategies form the basis for the initial 2050 Unconstrained Transportation Network. Working Group members are asked to discuss and provide feedback on the draft Unconstrained Transportation Network.
