6. REPORT FROM SCTCA REPRESENTATIVE TO SANDAG TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE (Boxie Phoenix, Barona) INFORMATION

Boxie Phoenix (Barona Band of Mission Indians) represents the Southern California Tribal Chairmen's Association (SCTCA) on the SANDAG Transportation Committee. He will report out to the Working Group on issues that have come before the Committee which may be of interest to the tribal community.

7. UPDATE FROM THE BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS (Supervisor Eben, BIA) DISCUSSION

As a follow-up to the November 3, 2010, Working Group meeting, the Southern California Agency of the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) organized a meeting on December 13 and 14, 2010 to discuss improving government-to-government relations between tribal nations in the region and the BIA. Supervisor Eben will report out on the meeting and next steps.

8. UPDATE ON FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION TRIBAL TRANSIT GRANT-ARRA FUNDING (Tony Largo, Reservation Transportation Authority) INFORMATION

The Reservation Transportation Authority (RTA) has successfully competed for the last three years for the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Tribal Transit grant program for operating funds which have been dedicated to the enhancements of the North County District Route 388, as recommended by the Working Group. As part of the FY 2009 grant cycle ARRA funds were made available to FY 2008 grantees. The RTA submitted and received a grant for \$1.2 million for capital improvements associated with the FTA Tribal Transit grant program. RTA Executive Director Tony Largo will update the Working Group on the implementation of this grant.

9. 2050 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN STATUS UPDATE (Heather Adamson) INFORMATION

Staff will provide a status update on the Preferred Revenue Constrained Transportation Network Scenario and next steps for the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).

- +10. INCLUSION OF TRIBAL TRANSPORTATION PLANS IN 2050 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN DRAFT (Jane Clough-Riquelme) INFORMATION/ DISCUSSION

It was suggested at the April 9, 2010, San Diego Regional Tribal Summit that those tribes who wanted to include their Tribal Transportation Plans (TTP) in the 2050 RTP should. SANDAG has prepared transportation maps for each tribe who acknowledged interest and a template for the basic information necessary for a TTP. A sample map and template are attached. This was distributed to all tribes at the December 21, 2010, SCTCA meeting along with each tribe's transportation map and then electronically to each tribe. The template and tribal resolution to include this information in the 2050 RTP is due January 31, 2011.

- +11. GRANT PROGRAM: COMMUNITIES PUTTING PREVENTION TO WORK (Vikrant Sood) INFORMATION/ DISCUSSION

SANDAG will administer four pass-through grant programs as part of the Communities Putting Prevention to Work (CPPW) project to promote health principles in planning, active transportation and safe routes to school. Tribal Governments are eligible to apply for all the grant programs. SANDAG released the Call for Projects for these programs on December 23, 2010. Applications are due on February 15, 2011. An applicant workshop is scheduled to provide more information and answer questions on January 13, 2011, 10 a.m. to 12 noon at SANDAG's office. More details are available on the Web site at www.sandag.org/cppw. Tribal Governments are highly encouraged to apply for these grant programs.
