6. MID-YEAR CRIME STATISTICS FOR THE SAN DIEGO REGION (INFORMATION)

On a semi-annual basis, SANDAG releases regional crime statistics that are compiled in cooperation with our regional local law enforcement.

Cindy Burke, Division Director, Applied Policy Research/Criminal Justice Research, presented an overview of these updated crime statistics.

7. ARJIS eALERTS (INFORMATION)

Law enforcement bulletins called "Be On The Lookout" (BOLOs) have been instrumental in identifying suspects in surveillance photos, finding fugitives, and returning recovered property to crime victims. With a grant from the Department of Homeland Security, ARJIS has automated this process, resulting in real-time selective distribution in the field to officers representing over 40 agencies through 15 different regional distribution lists. An overview of the application called eAlerts was presented along with success stories that have resulted in arrests and case closures.

Parole Agent Supervisor Marybeth Wilson and Parole Agent Hilda Perales (California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation), and Detective David Beatty (Chula Vista Police Department) presented this item with Pam Scanlon facilitating.

8. PERT: AN OVERVIEW OF THE PSYCHIATRIC EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (INFORMATION)

As part of the Psychiatric Emergency Response Team (PERT) program, a mental health crisis intervention team that includes a licensed mental health professional and a law enforcement officer/deputy respond to mental health-related emergencies that are brought to law enforcement's attention. The goal is to safely and effectively de-escalate crisis situations and provide appropriate referrals when necessary and offer the least restrictive level of care thus avoiding unnecessary hospitalizations and incarcerations.

Assistant Chief Cory Moles (Escondido Police Department) and Marla Kingkade (PERT, Inc.), presented an overview of this information.

Introduction

The San Diego County Probation Department was recently notified that it received competitive grant funding from the U.S. Department of Justice to ensure the implementation of evidence-based practice in the Post-Release Offender Unit. SANDAG has a long history of working with the Probation Department and collaborated on this grant application as the outside evaluator. As part of this two-year project, SANDAG research staff will document if implementation occurred as planned and measure outcomes related to recidivism.

Recommendation

The Public Safety Committee is asked to approve an amendment to the FY 2013 Program Budget to accept \$125,000 for new Work Element 23461 – SMART Probation Evaluation.

Discussion

With Assembly Bill 109 and public safety realignment, a comprehensive plan is needed to effectively implement the shifting of supervision from state parole to county supervision without compromising public safety. Based on this premise, a key component of the Community Corrections Partnership's (CCP) realignment plan is to ensure the use of EBP by Probation staff assigned to the PRO Unit, including using risk/need assessments, case planning, engaging offenders, and the use of incentives and sanctions. As part of the evaluation, SANDAG staff will document change over time in the knowledge, attitudes, and skills of the PRO Unit, as well as supervision practices; document assessed needs and whether services were provided to meet these needs; measure the nature and success of stakeholder partnership; and determine if needs were addressed, offenders successfully completed the terms of their supervision, and track which factors were predictive of revocation for a new offense or technical violation. The results of this evaluation will be integrated into other evaluation findings and results reported to key stakeholders on a regular basis.
