Turn LEFT onto VALLEY CENTER/CR S6
Turn RIGHT ONTO N. LAKE WOHLFORD RD.

Exit VIA RANCHO PARKWAY
Turn RIGHT onto E VIA RANCHO PARKWAY
E VIA RANCHO PARKWAY becomes BEAR VALLEY PKWY S.

Turn RIGHT onto LAKE WOHLFORD RD.

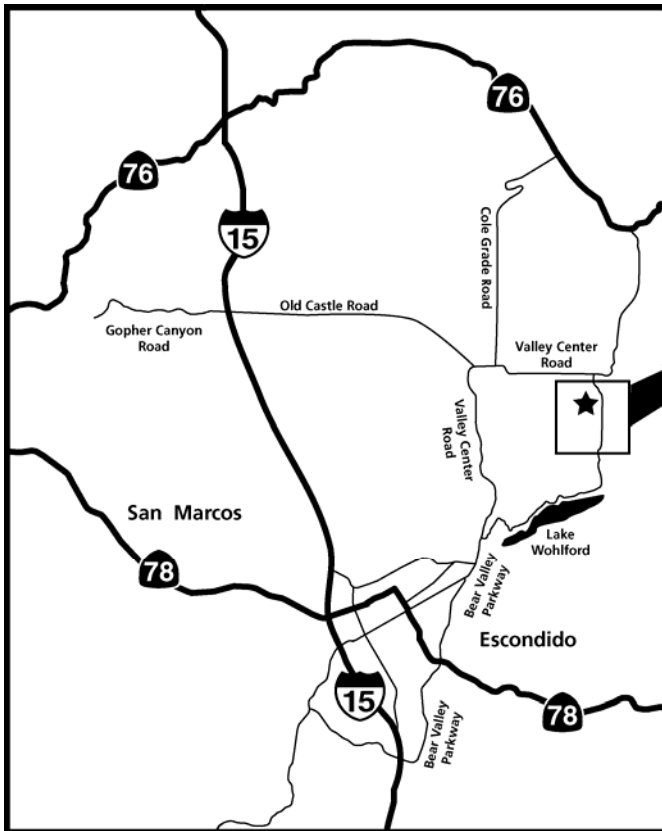
The San Pasqual Tribal Hall is on Kumeyaay Way, just south of the Valley View Casino entrance

Go West onto Kumeyaay Way

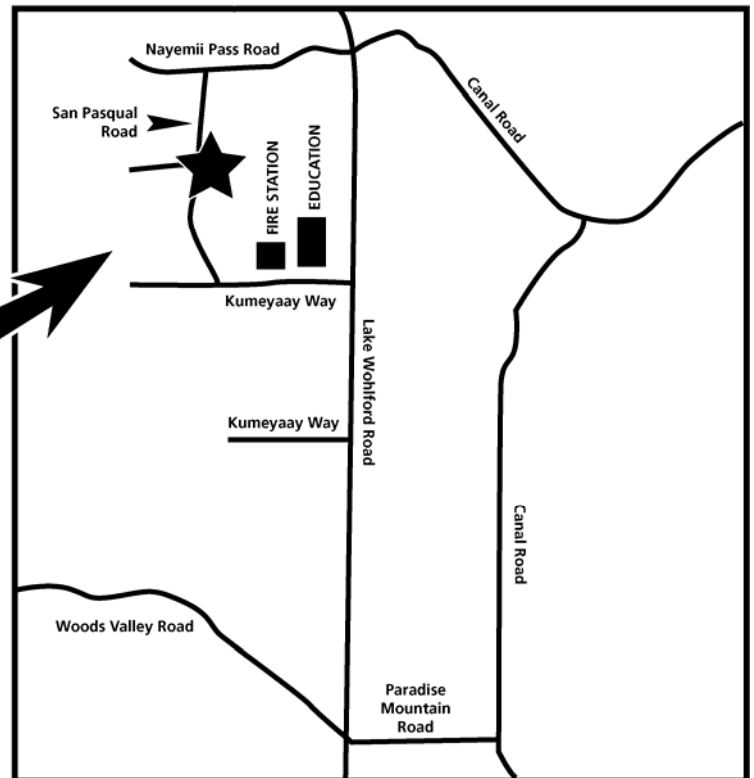
Go up the hill, past the Tribal Fire Station

CHAIR'S REPORT		
4.	2014-2018 COORDINATED PLAN (Brian Lane, SANDAG) The Regional Short-Range Transit Plan and Coordinated Plan provide a blueprint for the development of transit and human services transportation in the San Diego region over the next five years. Starting the week of October 14, 2013, SANDAG will conduct outreach events at five locations across the county to gather information on specialized transportation needs in the region. The input collected from the outreach effort will help to ensure that transportation projects sponsored by tribes or other groups are eligible for federal, state, and local grant programs. A draft of the plan will be developed based on this feedback and brought forward to the Transportation Committee on April 18, 2014, with a Public Hearing to follow on May 16, 2014. It is anticipated that the SANDAG Board of Directors would adopt the 2014-2018 Coordinated Plan on June 27, 2014.	INFORMATION

- +5. SAN DIEGO FORWARD: THE REGIONAL PLAN: DRAFT UNCONSTRAINED TRANSPORTATION NETWORK (Phil Trom, SANDAG) DISCUSSION**

Attached is the staff report presented to the Transportation Committee on September 6, 2013, for the Working Group's information. Defining the Unconstrained Transportation Network is an important step in developing the Regional Plan, because it establishes the broadest network from which funding scenarios will be identified. Once the Unconstrained Transportation Network is finalized, staff will rank all of the future projects using the Evaluation Criteria currently under development. Staff is now seeking input on the development of the draft Unconstrained Transportation Network. Staff will review the draft Unconstrained Transportation Network with the Transportation and Regional Planning Committees in October 2013.

- +6. REVIEW OF TRIBAL TRANSIT FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR CONSIDERATION IN SAN DIEGO FORWARD: THE REGIONAL PLAN (Brian Lane, SANDAG) DISCUSSION**

As part of San Diego Forward: The Regional Plan, SANDAG is analyzing the transit service in the system. SANDAG transit staff will review the Tribal Transit Feasibility Study conducted by the Working Group in 2008 to initiate a discussion for consideration in San Diego Forward.

- 7. POTENTIAL TRIBAL PROJECTS TO INCLUDE IN SAN DIEGO FORWARD: THE REGIONAL PLAN (Coleen Clementson, SANDAG) DISCUSSION**

At the July 24, 2013, meeting, Working Group members identified key areas of need for transportation improvements. Working Group members are asked to identify potential tribal projects that could be included in the Regional Plan.

- 8. STRATEGIC DISCUSSION ON TRIBAL TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT OPTIONS (Kim Weinstein, SANDAG) DISCUSSION**

Transportation Demand Management refers to programs that facilitate travel/movement without building new infrastructure (vanpools, carpools, telework). The Reservation Transportation Authority, working with several tribes in the region, conducted some initial commuter surveys among gaming facilities to determine the feasibility of vanpool programs at tribal employment centers. SANDAG staff will facilitate a discussion on options that should be considered in the plan.

- +9. SAN DIEGO FORWARD: THE REGIONAL PLAN: DRAFT PERFORMANCE MEASURES (Rachel Kennedy, SANDAG) DISCUSSION**

The SANDAG Board of Directors accepted the San Diego Forward: The Regional Plan vision and goals on May 10, 2013. In past Regional Transportation Plans, SANDAG has utilized transportation project evaluation criteria and performance measures informed by these goals as elements of a multistep process to develop the revenue constrained multimodal transportation network. SANDAG has developed preliminary draft performance measures to be used for evaluating alternative revenue constrained multimodal transportation scenarios for San Diego Forward: The Regional Plan. The Working Group will be asked to discuss and provide input on the preliminary draft performance measures.
