APRIL 30, 2018, MEETING MINUTES

Chair Greg Cox (County of San Diego) called the meeting of the Bayshore Bikeway Working Group (Working Group) to order at at 10:01 a.m.

1. INTRODUCTION

Self-Introductions were conducted.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS/COMMUNICATIONS/MEMBER COMMENTS

There were no public comments or communications.

3. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES (APPROVE)

Action: Upon a motion by Mike Woiwode (Public Member) and a second by Councilmember Mark West (City of Imperial Beach), the Working Group approved the minutes from its January 19, 2018, meeting. Yes: Chair Cox, Councilmember Michael Donovan (City of Coronado), Councilmember West, Commissioner Robert "Dukie" Vaderrama (Port of San Diego), and Mr. Woiwode. No: None. Abstain: None. Absent: City of Chula Vista, City of National City, City of San Diego, and San Diego County Bicycle Coalition.

REPORTS

4. SANDAG 2018 TITLE VI PROGRAM SURVEY (INFORMATION)

Sam Sanford, Associate Regional Planner, asked the Working Group to complete a brief survey on race and ethnicity for the SANDAG Title VI program, required under the Civil Rights Act of 1964 that protects people from discrimination based on race, color, or national origin in programs or activities that receive federal financial assistance. Staff will send a link to the survey in an email to the group.

Action: This item was presented for information.

5. PEDESTRIAN FACILITIES ON THE BAYSHORE BIKEWAY (DISCUSSION)

Stephan Vance, Senior Regional Planner, discussed the growing interest to provide a separate place for people to walk on the Bayshore Bikeway, especially in the Cities of Imperial Beach and Coronado. The Working Group discussed how to attract additional resources for this purpose.

Commissioner Vaderrama asked Mr. Donovan about the City of Coronado's stance on dockless bike-sharing companies, such as LimeBike, and what the City of Coronado is doing to tackle any of the issues that may be imposed to the City of Coronado. The City of Coronado has decided to impose a fee for any bikes left in the right-of-way for more than two hours, and that the bike would be tagged, picked up, and placed in the public service yard.

Action: This item was presented for discussion.

6. NATIONAL CITY ALIGNMENT STATUS REPORT (DISCUSSION)

Anna Buzaitis, Port of San Diego (Port), discussed the work developing the ultimate alignment for the bike path south of Civic Center Drive in the City of National City as part of the bayfront and marine terminal redevelopment planning by the Port.

Ms. Buzaitis reported that the Port has revised the preliminary design based on stakeholder comments. The plans will be used in a State Active Transportation Program grant application that is being prepared by the City of National City and the Port, which is due to Caltrans on July 31, 2018. The grant will support final engineering and construction. The total construction cost estimate is \$3.5 million. Ms. Buzaitis requested that Working Group support the proposed alignment for the bayfront redevelopment Environmental Impact Report.

Commissioner Valderrama recommended supporting the proposed new Bayshore Bikeway alignment through the City of National City.

Action: Upon a motion by Commissioner Valderrama and a second by Councilmember West, the Working Group unanimously voted in favor of the recommendation. Yes: Chair Cox, Councilmember Donovan, Councilmember West, Commissioner Vaderrama, Councilmember Albert Mendivil (City of National City), and Mr. Woiwode. No: None. Absent: City of Chula Vista, City of San Diego, and San Diego County Bicycle Coalition.

Linda Culp, Principal Regional Planner, said that SANDAG will add language to its letter of support to include the support of the Working Group.

Commissioner Valderrama recommended that the Working Group urge the Port to identify funds that can be used as a local match in the grant application.

Action: Upon a motion by Commissioner Valderrama and a second by Chair Cox, Working Group unanimously voted in favor of the recommendation. Yes: Chair Cox, Councilmember Donovan, Councilmember West, Councilmember Mendivil, Commissioner Vaderrama, and Mr. Woiwode. No: None. Absent: City of San Diego, City of Chula Vista, and San Diego County Bicycle Coalition.

7. BARRIO LOGAN SEGMENT STATUS REPORT (INFORMATION)

Mr. Vance reported on final design work for this project with a focus on the design of the 32nd Street intersection, and ongoing coordination with stakeholders.

Alternatives for improving sight distance at the intersection were presented, including an alternative that would remove the two existing pedestrian bridges. Captain Roy Love, Naval Base San Diego, described the traffic issues at the intersection of 32nd Street, expected increases in Navy personnel in

the coming years, and efforts being made by the Navy to encourage transit access to the base. He thought the bridges were important to support that effort. After a broad discussion of the alternatives, the Working Group confirmed its support, expressed at the June 2018 meeting for the removal of the bridges, with the understanding that all the concerned parties would pursue funding in the future to construct new bridges that meet modern standards. Staff also agreed to consider incorporating an additional southbound right turn only lane on Harbor Drive at 32nd Street.

Action: This item was presented for information.

8. PALOMAR STREET TO MAIN STREET (SEGMENT 8B) STATUS REPORT (INFORMATION)

Mr. Vance reported on the ongoing efforts to resolve the right of way issues that are the critical path items for this project.

Action: This item was presented for information.

9. UPDATES ON PROJECTS RELATED TO THE BAYSHORE BIKEWAY (INFORMATION)

Members of the Working Group provided information on local projects related to the Bayshore Bikeway.
