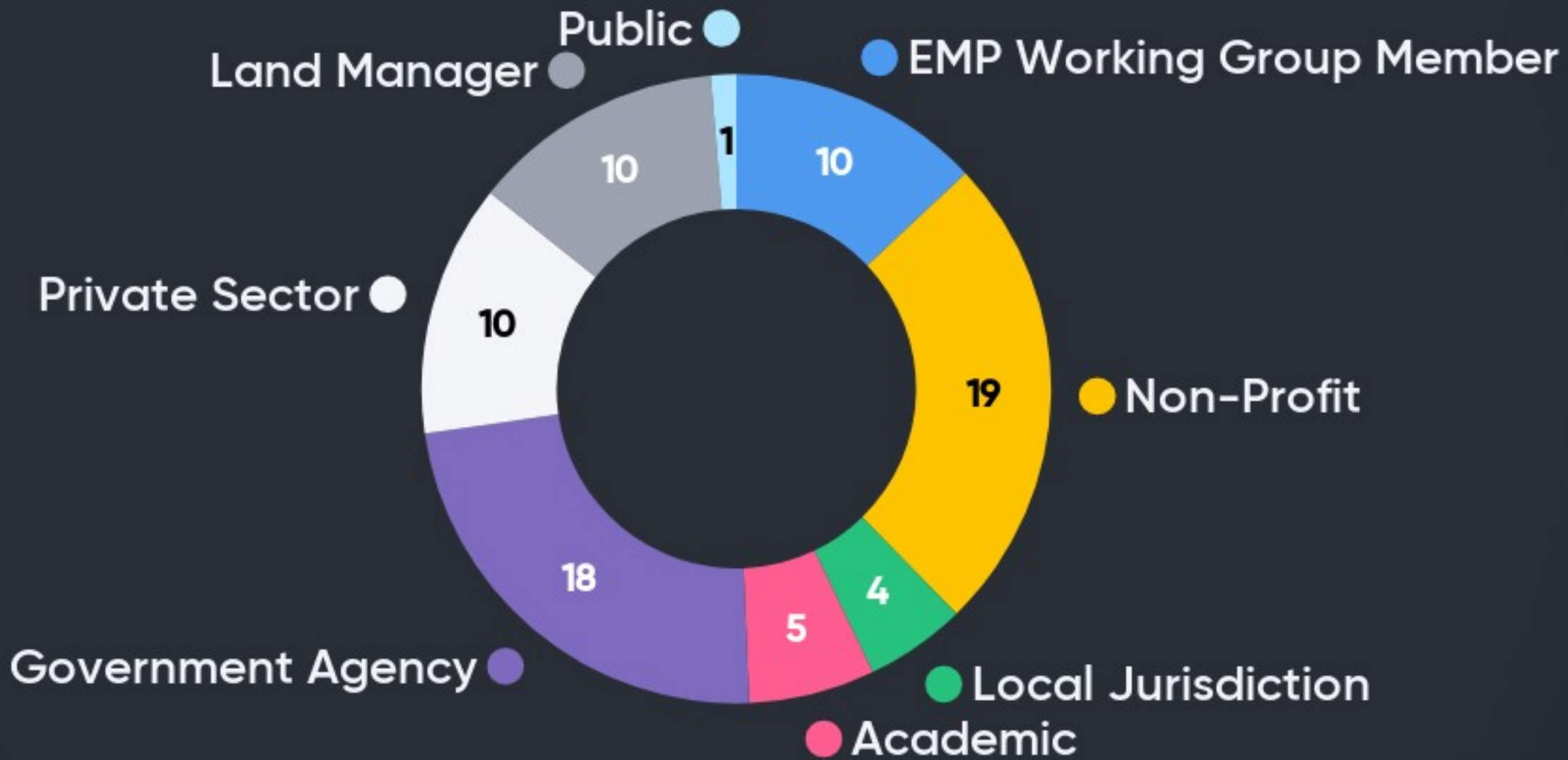

Impact analysis - cumulative impacts

To meet management goals. To seek funding for management actions.

Inform management needs

Inform future restoration efforts and land acquisitions.

Assist land managers develop management priorities

Know where to focus my energy

To communicate with managers about whats important and how to invest optimally in management actions.

How would you/your organization utilize a preserve metric report card?

To demonstrate whether or not our Forest Plan and management is contributing to regional conservation goals.

Evidence of conservation and management success

As a communication tool

To show the success of our program and efforts to the public.

To identify data gaps and research needs

Use data for a focused solution to a problem

Compliance and effectiveness monitoring of HCP/NCCP preserves in a regulatory context.

Cost analysis. Is there enough money to do what we consider important. How would we rank what we consider most important and use adaptive management for the rest.

To show success of the preserve system to the public, as well as areas of management need.

Resource management

Public engagement

Tie the metrics and report card to K-12 education.

To measure environmental benefits and access for residents, by subregion

3 categories: happy face, meh face, sad face
6 categories: A-F with color coding
Break groups up using functional thresholds where possible

Land planning.

Use it for project evaluation and strategic plan updating for organization.

To show success of the program used to mitigate our construction projects with regionally significant conservation.

Educate the public about importance of conservation and threats from recreational pressure.



How would you/your organization utilize a preserve metric report card?

Use to promote HCP/NCCPs with legislators and the public

We would know that what we are doing for management matters. Make sure we are not missing big items

To guide management decisions/acquisitions strategy. Develop Preserve specific and regional goals. Target funding opportunities.

To identify gaps in knowledge of different wildlife and plant species in order to fill that research deficit.

To guide priorities and evaluation of Rose canyon

To help us make the case that the preserve is working as it is, and agreements made should be honored instead of saying times have changed, too bad you counted on it for all these years.

To align our research proposals to topics with documented need for projects.

Inform policy makers on land use decisions. Inform land managers on areas to focus resources for effective resource improvement/recovery.

Use it for education and outreach to internal and external stakeholders, work collaboratively with other land managers and guide land management decisions.

How would you/your organization utilize a preserve metric report card?

Monitor progress in addressing impacts of climate change on open space systems

To look at preserves that may have the most important wildlife corridors. And/or The most diverse or otherwise "important" preserves get the most management. And/or which preserves need the most enforcement (human use high, biodiversity high, etc)

prioritize management/monitoring decisions

Adjust preservation goals and management based on regional metrics instead of just project based goals
