The Bayshore Bikeway Working Group meeting scheduled for Wednesday, May 11, 2022, will be conducted virtually in accordance with Governor Newsom's State of Emergency declaration regarding the COVID-19 outbreak, Government Code Section 54953(e), Assembly Bill 361 (Rivas, 2021), and the COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards issued by the California Department of Industrial Relations. Working Group members will primarily participate in the meeting virtually, while practicing social distancing, from individual remote locations.

October 13, 2021, Meeting Minutes

Chair Marcus Bush (City of National City) called the meeting of the Bayshore Bikeway Working Group to order at 2:31 p.m.

1. Welcome and Introductions
2. Approval of Meeting Minutes (Approve)

There were no public comments on this item.

Action: Upon a motion by Commissioner Sandy Narajano (Port of San Diego) and a second by Vice Chair Matthew Leyba-Gonzalez (City of Imperial Beach), the Bayshore Bikeway Working Group voted to approve the minutes from its April 28, 2021, meeting.

The motion passed.

Yes: Chair Bush, Vice Chair Leyba-Gonzalez, Councilmember Jill Galvez (City of Chula Vista), Councilmember Mike Donovan (City of Coronado), Andy Hanshaw (San Diego County Bicycle Coalition), Commissioner Naranjo.

Abstain: Mike Woiwode (Public Member).

Absent: City of San Diego and County of San Diego.

3. Public Comments/Communications/Member Comments

Member of the Public Andy Hanshaw requested updates on any planned bikeways on Port tidelands.

Reports

4. Bayshore Bikeway Signage and Striping Improvements Projects (Information)

Eric Minicilli (City of Imperial Beach) identified issues and signage solutions for reducing bicyclist and pedestrian conflicts on the Bayshore Bikeway segment adjacent to high attractor / generator land uses in the City of Imperial Beach. Matt Capuzzi recommended incorporating "shark teeth" advance yield markings for people biking aware pedestrian crossings, and truncated domes to give pedestrians notice when approaching the bikeway. Councilmember Donovan suggested City of Imperial Beach staff reach out to City of Coronado for coordination on similar efforts. City of Coronado active transportation planner Howard Lee informed the group that a Bid Package was being prepared for similar treatment on the Bayshore Bikeway in Coronado. Phil Monroe suggested sign assemblies similar to the Stevens Creek Trail in Mountain View which read, "announce yourself when passing" "pass on the left." Stephan Vance proposed separate bike and pedestrian travel ways along as much of the Bayshore Bikeway as possible as the ideal long-term solution.

5. Bayshore Bikeway Resiliency Project (Information)

Chris Helmer (City of Imperial Beach), Dennis Larson (Nexus Planning), and Brian Leslie (GHD) provided an overview of this recently initiated long-range project which includes initial strategies for improving the Bayshore Bikeway with separation of spaces for a growing number of users, along with flood protection measures with rising sea levels. Chair Bush asked for clarification on sea level rise projections and the latest projections in the project area. Vice Chair Leyba-Gonzalez encouraged the project team to expedite this project to help with known issues that this project improvement can address now.

6. Border to Bayshore Bikeway Status Report (Information)

Madai Parra (SANDAG) provided project updates (phase, schedule, and funding) on the Border to Bayshore Bikeway. Vice Chair Leyba-Gonzalez voiced support and an eagerness for the project to begin construction. Chris Jonsmyr (City of San Diego Councilmember Moreno's Office) updated the group on adjacent affordable housing sites in the project area and voiced support for the bikeway project. Greg Cox suggested SANDAG staff coordinate with the County and City of San Diego on a California Coastal Trail alignment.

7. 8B Segment Status Report (Information)

Omar Atayee (SANDAG) shared an update on a 4-mile segment of the Bayshore Bikeway.

8. Bayshore Bikeway Segment 5 (Information)

Matt Capuzzi (CR Associates) gave a progress update on Segment 5 in the City of National City. Chair Bush asked about the alignment adjacent to the Sweetwater Marsh, Matt clarified it will be within 100 feet of the marsh with the inclusion of a "fence that cannot be seen through" as per Fish and Wildlife regulations. Vice Chair Leyba-Gonzalez inquired about this and other "enhanced connection" projects in the City of National City interfacing with Interstate 5 (I-5).

9. Chollas Creek Bikeway Status Report (Information)

Everett Hauser (City of San Diego) was unable to provide an update due to schedule conflicts during this meeting time.

10. Barrio Logan Segment Status Report (Information)

Dinara Ussenova (SANDAG) provided project updates (phase, schedule, and funding) on the Barrio Logan Segment of the Bayshore Bikeway.

11. Updates on Projects Related to the Bayshore Bikeway (Information)

Matt Capuzzi (CR Associates) gave a progress update on a conversion of 18th Street to two-way traffic and closing 19th Street in the City of National City underneath railways and I-5. Commissioner Naranjo requested the cost total for these projects – Segment 5 is \$6.3 million and West 19th Street is \$1.8 million – to coordinate the spending of recently-allocated Port funds. Chair Bush mentioned the importance of connections like this that prioritize non-motorized users connecting across I5 from Old Town National City to the Bayshore Bikeway and waterfront. Josh Clark (SANDAG) requested an update on Bayshore Bikeway Segment 1 plans in the Port's 1Hwy1 project. Commissioner Naranjo mentioned a draft EIR for the National City Balance Plan.

12. Upcoming Meetings

The next Bayshore Bikeway Working Group meeting is scheduled for May 11, 2022, at 2:30 p.m.

13. Adjournment

Chair Bush adjourned the meeting at 4:08 p.m.
