- 5 p.m. Arrival at SANDAG offices**

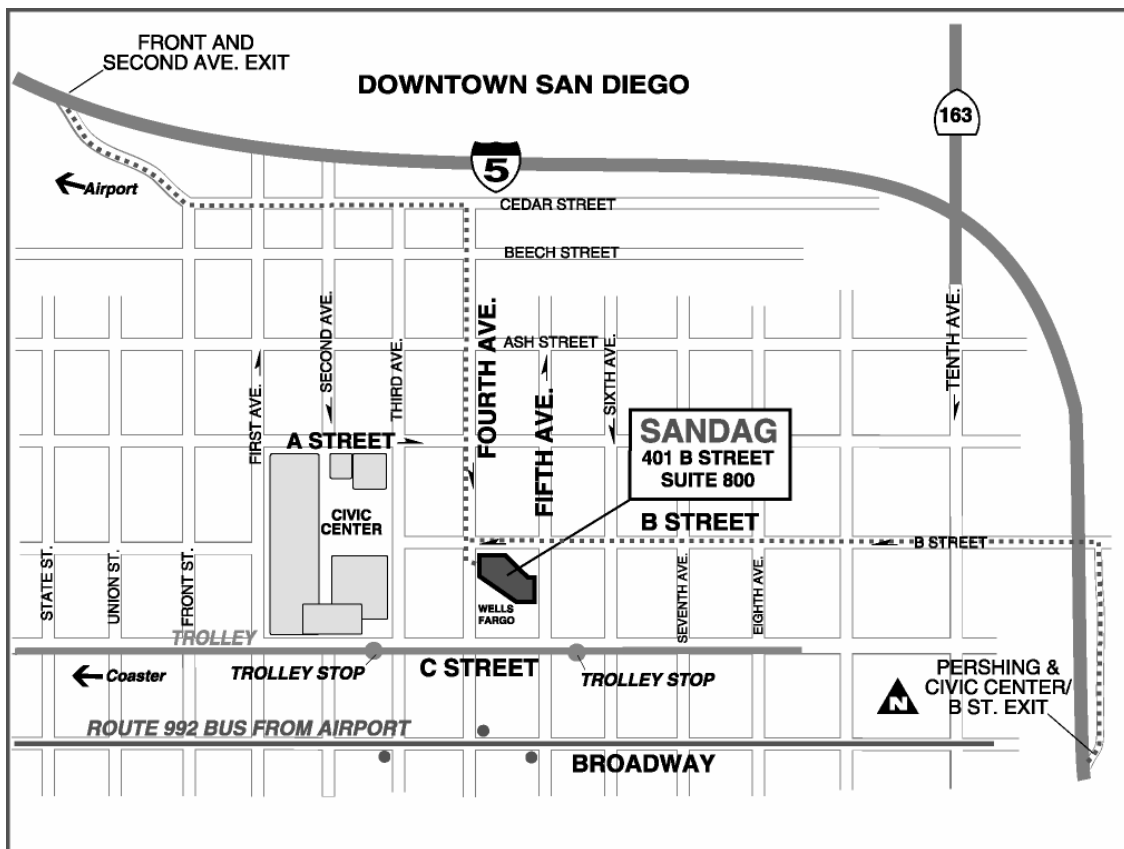
