Mid-Coast Corridor Transit Project update

Planning for the Mid-Coast Corridor Transit Project continues to move forward. SANDAG staff is nearing completion on the Draft Comparative Evaluation of Alternatives report, which will provide important technical information about each of the alternatives studied. The alternatives include several Light Rail Transit (Trolley) alternatives, a Bus Rapid Transit alternative, a Coaster shuttle alternative, a Transportation Systems Management alternative, and a "no build" alternative. The report will provide information about projected ridership, capital investment, and other data used to evaluate the alternatives.

Once complete, this information will be presented to the Project Working Group, the SANDAG Transportation Committee, and SANDAG Board for recommendations and direction about which alternatives should move forward in the process.
