Crime in the San Diego Region Mid-Year 2017 Statistics

Introduction

Since 1980, SANDAG has been compiling and reporting regional crime statistics for San Diego County and remains the only local source for regional statistics not available at the national level. This summary presents information regarding how many and what types of Part I crimes were reported to local law enforcement in the first half of 2017 and how these numbers compare to prior years. These data are useful to local law enforcement agencies as they track the effectiveness of their prevention and response efforts on jurisdictional and regional crime rates.

Violent crime

- A total of 5,421 Part I violent crimes were reported to local law enforcement agencies in the region between January and June 2017 (Tables 1 and 6), an average of 30 per day (not shown). Part I violent crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.¹
- Of the 17 jurisdictions with violent crime numbers that were able to be compared (more than 30), 12 had a higher violent crime rate in the first six months of 2017 compared to 2016, and 5 had a lower one (Table 3).
- There were 42 homicides in the first half of 2017, a decrease of 14 percent from mid-year 2016 when 49 occurred (Tables 1 and 8).
- There were 534 rapes reported to law enforcement in San Diego County in the first half of 2017 using the new UCR definition, compared to 550 in the first half of 2016 and 511 in the first half of 2015, when the new definition was first used (Tables 1 and 8).
- The number of robberies reported across the region increased 3 percent from mid-year 2016 (1,389) to 2017 (1,437). This represented the fourth annual mid-year increase (Tables 1 and 8). Robberies on streets, the most common location type, increased by 3 percent, as did those in businesses (up 8%) and in residences (up 5%). Bank robberies were down 36 percent (from 28 to 18) (not shown).
- The 3,408 aggravated assaults reported during the first six months of the year represented a 1 percent increase from the prior year (Tables 1 and 8). There were 8,407 domestic violence incidents reported, which include aggravated assaults and other offenses (both violent and property), an increase of 2 percent from the 8,273 reported in the first half of 2016 (not shown).

Highlights

Compared to mid-year 2016, there were fewer homicides (14% decrease) and rapes (3% decrease) reported to law enforcement in the San Diego region in the first half of 2017. However, the number of robberies and aggravated assaults were up slightly (3% and 1% increases, respectively), as were the number of domestic violence incidents (up 2%).

For property crime, fewer were reported in each category, including burglary (down 9%), larceny (down 9%), and motor vehicle theft (down 13%). However, while residential burglaries were down (by 22%), non-residential were up (by 13%).

¹ When interpreting these mid-year figures, it is important to note that in 2015, California law enforcement agencies began to use the new and broader Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) definition of rape that includes male victims, sodomy, penetration with any body part or objects, and no longer requires force. As a result of this change, some Part I crimes that previously would have been aggravated assaults are now rapes and some Part II crimes that previously would not have been captured in these statistics are now Part I crimes.

Property crime

- A total of 28,451 property crimes were reported to local law enforcement agencies in the first half of 2017 (Tables 1 and 7). This equates to an average of 157 per day. Sixty-six percent (66%) of these property crimes were larcenies, 17 percent burglaries, and 17 percent motor vehicle thefts (not shown).
- Of the 25 jurisdictions with property crime numbers that were able to be compared (more than 30), 9 had a higher property crime rate in the first six months of 2017 compared to 2016, 15 had a lower one, and 1 had no change (Table 4).
- The 4,757 burglaries reported in the San Diego region in the first half of 2017 represented a decrease of 9 percent from the first half of 2016 (when there were 5,254). However, while residential burglaries decreased 22 percent, non-residential burglaries were up 13 percent. Fifty-five percent (55%) of burglaries in the first half of 2017 were residential (Tables 1 and 8).
- The number of larcenies reported in the region at mid-year 2017 (18,888) represented a 9 percent decrease from mid-year 2016. Petty theft (estimated value of items stolen \$400 and under) decreased by 5 percent and grand theft decreased by 15 percent (Tables 1 and 8).
- Across the seven types of larcenies, there were decreases in all of the categories, with the largest in the shoplifting (-24%), pickpocketing (-14%), and bicycle theft (-14%) categories (not shown).
- Motor vehicle theft decreased 13 percent from mid-year 2016 to 2017, from 5,504 vehicles stolen at mid-year 2016 to 4,806 at mid-year 2017 (Tables 1 and 8).
- There were 173 arsons reported by law enforcement in the first half of 2017, down from 224 the first half of 2016, a decrease of 23 percent (Tables 10 and 11).

Background

The ability for SANDAG to analyze data and produce reports on crime trends for the region relies upon a cooperative agreement with each local law enforcement agency. SANDAG obtains crime data from every agency on a monthly basis, allowing the presentation of regional crime data in a timely manner.

Crimes are categorized according to the FBI's standardized UCR guidelines for law enforcement agencies across the country. Reported crimes are tallied in ARJIS according to the date of data entry, which may or may not reflect the day of occurrence. It should be noted that while local law enforcement agencies strive to tabulate their statistics in a timely fashion, data entry delays sometimes occur, which may affect statistics.

The mid-year crime rates per 1,000 residents are estimated by multiplying the number of crimes reported between January and June by 2 and dividing that number by the population which has been divided by 1,000.

The statistics presented in this CJ Bulletin include crime rates and numbers for San Diego County and individual jurisdictions for the first half of 2017. Comparisons are made to prior years. The number and type of crimes that are reported can be influenced by several factors, including the degree of opportunity to commit crimes in a given jurisdiction, which can be related to the amount of commercial land use and ease of access to the area.

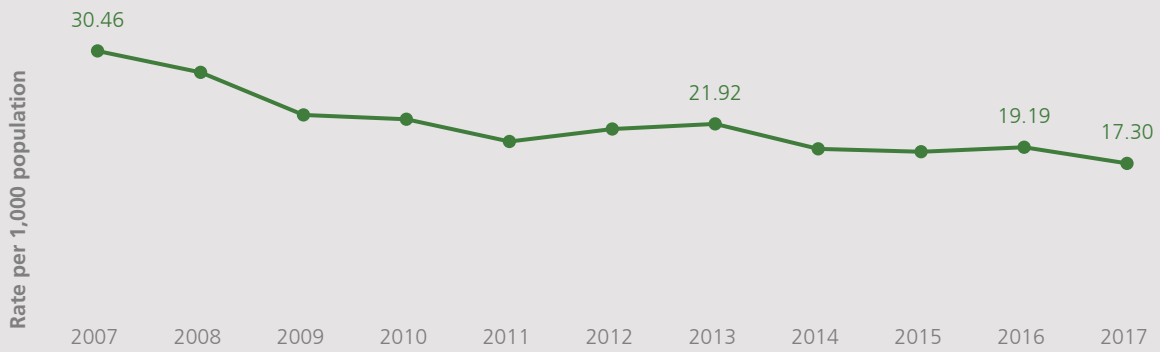
