Arrests 2016: Law Enforcement Response to Crime in the San Diego Region

FEBRUARY 2018

Research findings from the Criminal Justice Clearinghouse

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Introduction

The Criminal Justice Research Division of the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) functions as the Clearinghouse for regional criminal justice information. On an annual basis, the Division prepares a report on local criminal justice agencies' response to crime in the region, as measured by arrest statistics. Because arrest statistics include information regarding whether the suspect is an adult or juvenile, and include a greater variety of crime types than are reported in regional crime reports (e.g., alcohol/drug-related offenses), this information provides an added dimension for understanding the nature of crime and another measure that can be used in justice system planning.

This CJ Bulletin includes regional arrest rates per 1,000 for both the adult and juvenile population, as well as numbers of arrests by offense type. In addition, 42 supplemental tables, which include statistics for individual jurisdictions, are presented. Some points to remember when interpreting these numbers include the following:

- Similar to how the FBI counts reported crimes, the offense or charge attributed to an arrest reflects only the most serious out of potentially multiple violations included in the arrest.
- Arrests are documented by the location at which the arrest occurred and cannot be assumed to have any relationship to the location of the crime incident or the residence of the alleged offender.
- Arrest and crime rates and numbers should not be compared to one another. One reason is that the two events may occur in two entirely different periods of time, with an arrest made months or even years after the related crime was reported.
- For youth, even though contact with law enforcement is made and an arrest report is taken, diversion to a community-based or other type of program or release to a parent or guardian may occur as an alternative to juvenile justice system processing.
- The data presented here were provided by the California Department of Justice through a public records request. While these are official numbers reported to and by the State, it is important to note they may vary from other sources that could be available.

Highlights

- The arrest rates in San Diego County for both adults and juveniles were at ten-year lows in 2016, with a 23 percent drop for adults and a 66 percent drop for juveniles since 2007 (page 4).
- In 2015, the year following the passage of Proposition 47 (Prop 47), which reduced certain property- and drug-related offenses from felonies to misdemeanors, the felony arrest rate decreased 28 percent and the misdemeanor arrest rate increased 11 percent. In 2016, the felony arrest rate decreased slightly from 2015 (-2%), but interestingly, the misdemeanor arrest rate declined also, and to a greater degree (-4%) (page 4).
- San Diego County had the second highest adult and juvenile arrest rates of the five largest California counties in 2016, following only San Bernardino (page 5).
- In 2016, 226 adult arrests and 15 juvenile arrests were made per day on average in the San Diego region (page 6).
- Since 2007, the proportion of all adult arrests that were alcohol/drug-related decreased from around half (51%) to about two in five (41%). Over the same time, the proportion of property arrests that were at the felony-level decreased (from 73% to 45%), as did those in the alcohol/drug category (from 17% to 8%) (pages 7 and 8).

Arrest rates

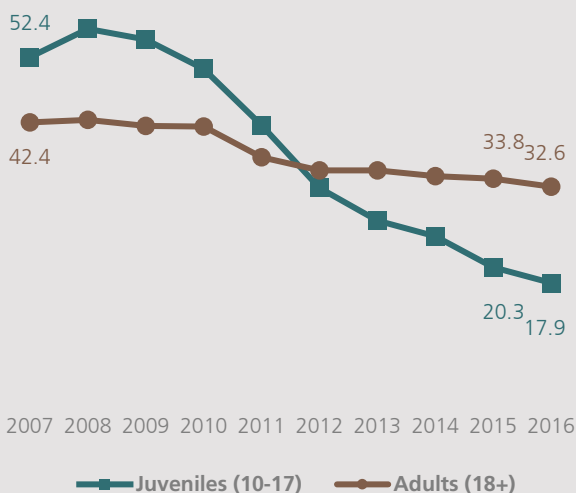
Trends

In 2016, there were 32.6 adults arrested per 1,000 population. As Figure 1 shows, this rate represented a ten-year low and a decrease of 23 percent since 2007. It was also the third consecutive drop and a rate that was 4 percent lower than in 2015 (when it was 33.8). Across the jurisdictions, the 2016 adult arrest rate varied from 11.8 to 57.1, with one year decreases in 13 of the jurisdictions and increases in the other 6 (Table 6).

Until 2012, the arrest rate was traditionally higher for juveniles than adults, but this reversed in 2012. As Figure 1 shows, the 2016 juvenile arrest rate of 17.9 represented a decrease of 66 percent from 2007, was a ten-year low, and represented the eighth consecutive decrease. Across the jurisdictions, the juvenile arrest rate varied from 2.0 to 35.8 in 2016, with 10 of the agencies reporting one-year decreases, 6 agencies one-year increases, and for 3, the number of arrests was too small to compare (Table 9).

Arrest rates down for adults and juveniles, but drop for juveniles over past ten years greater



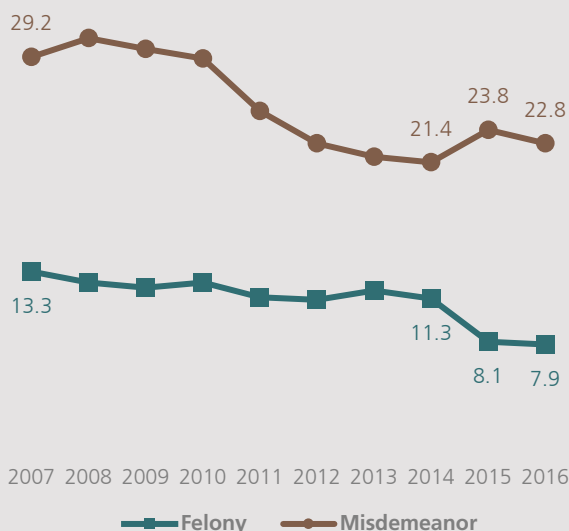

Felonies and misdemeanors

In 2015, the year following the passage of Prop 47, which reduced a number of property- and drug-related offenses from felonies to misdemeanors, the felony arrest rate declined by 28 percent (from 2014) and the misdemeanor arrest rate increased by 11 percent (Figure 2). In 2016, interestingly, the felony arrest rate continued to decline (-2%), but the misdemeanor arrest rate also declined, by 4 percent. As Tables 7, 8, 10, and 11 show, felony and misdemeanor arrests decreased over the past year for both adults (-2% and -4%, respectively) and juveniles (-8% and -7%, respectively).

Arrestee race and age

Arrest rates also varied by race/ethnicity for both adults and juveniles, with individuals of “other” races/ethnicities having the lowest rate (13.5), while Blacks had the highest rate (106.4). Over the past year, the arrest rate decreased for all ethnic groups, ranging from <1 percent for Hispanic and Black to 7 percent for White (Table 2A).

Arrest data by age showed that in 2016, adults between 20 and 29 had the highest arrest rate (53.9), followed by those 30 to 39 (45.2), 18 and 19 (40.5), and 40 to 69 (24.7). It is interesting to note that in 2012, those 18 and 19 had the highest arrest rate of any of the age groups and that over the past five years, the arrest rate for this group decreased 33 percent (Figure 3 and Table 2B).

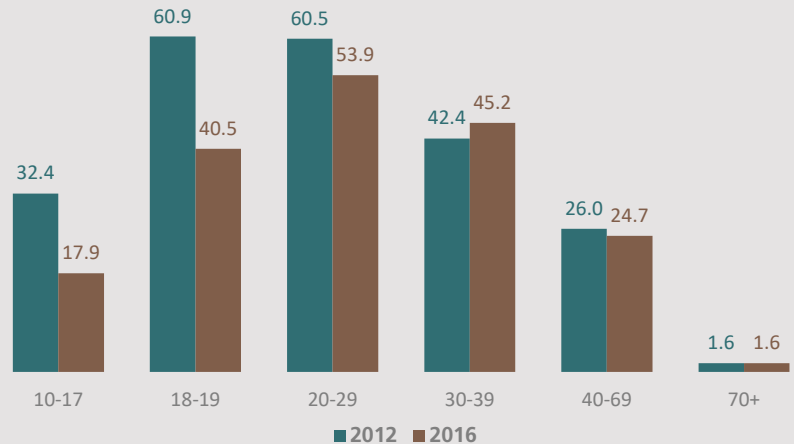
San Diego compared to other California counties

In 2016, San Diego County had an adult arrest rate (32.6) that was lower than the State’s (35.6), but a juvenile arrest rate that was higher statewide (17.9 versus 15.3) than the State.¹ Compared to the other largest California counties, San Diego had the second-highest adult and juvenile arrest rates, following only San Bernardino. For adults, all of the large counties had decreases in their adult arrest rate (ranging from 1% to 4%), except for Orange, which increased 3 percent. For juveniles, all of the largest counties had one-year decreases, ranging from 8 percent in Orange to 23 percent in Riverside (Figure 4 and Table 5).

¹ It should be noted that the State’s total and juvenile numbers and rates vary from those presented here because arrests of those under the age of 10 have not been included in this San Diego County report, but appear to have been in the State’s most recent report. In addition, there are differences in the population numbers used to calculate rates, with this report consistently using the most recent available from the U.S. Census and American Community Service (ACS) and including the entire population 10 and older.

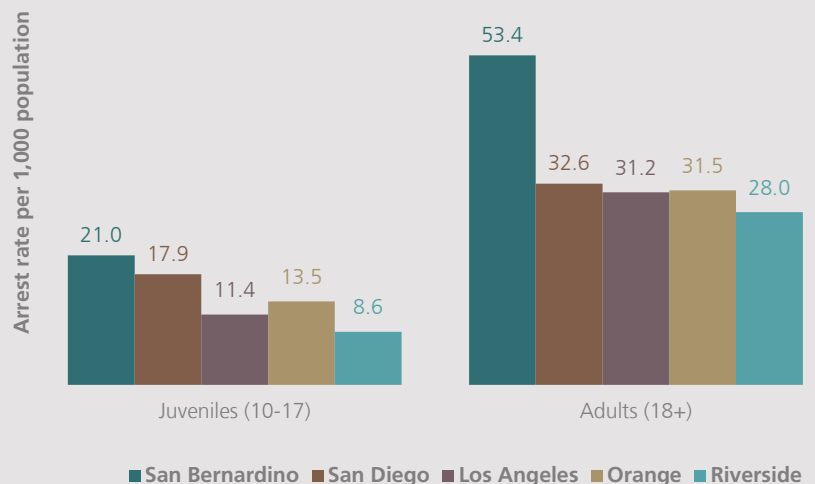
Since 2012, the arrest rate has declined for all groups but those 30 to 39

San Diego County had second highest juvenile and adult arrest rates in 2016 compared to other large California counties



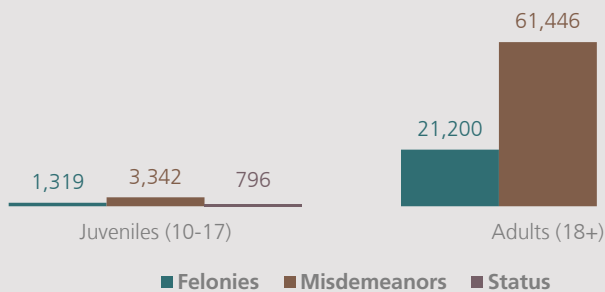

Number of adult and juvenile arrests

In 2016, there were 82,646 adult arrests (21,200 at the felony level and 61,446 at the misdemeanor level), and 5,457 juvenile arrests (1,319 felonies, 3,342 misdemeanors, and 796 status offenses²) (Figure 5 and Tables 13-15, and 26-28). On average, there were around 226 adult and 15 juvenile arrests every day in 2016 in the San Diego region by local law enforcement agencies (not shown).

In 2016, there were almost three adult misdemeanor arrests for every one adult felony arrest

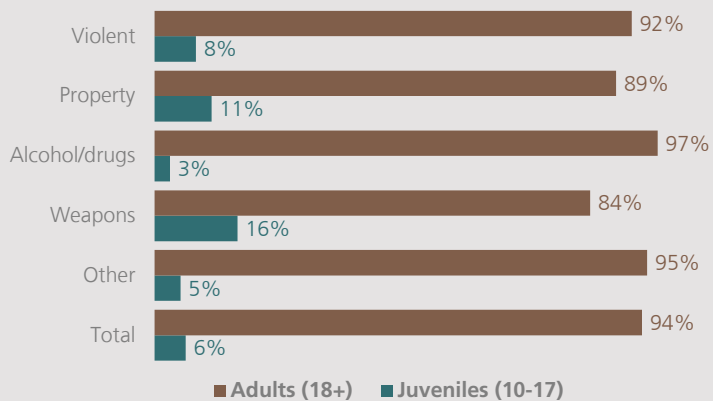

As Figure 6 shows, while 6 percent of all arrests in 2016 were of juveniles, there was variation by crime type, with juveniles representing a greater proportion of arrests for weapons (16%) and property (11%) offenses, and a smaller proportion of arrests for alcohol/drug-related offenses (3%).

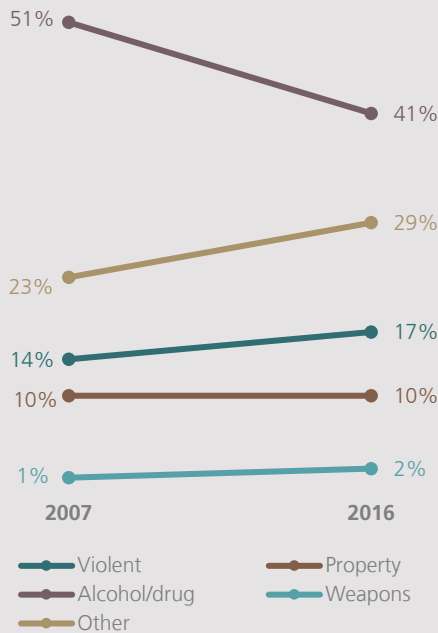
Arrests by offense type

What types of crimes are adults and juveniles arrested for? As Figure 7A shows, in 2016, about two in five (41%) adults were arrested for an alcohol/drug-related offense, making it the most common category, followed by “other” arrests (29%), violent offenses (17%), property offenses (10%), and weapon offenses (2%). Compared to ten years ago, the proportion of arrests that were alcohol/drug-related decreased, and those that were in the “other” category or violent category increased.

For juveniles (Figure 7B), the distribution across categories was more equal than for adults, with about one in five arrests in each of the categories, with the exception of status offenses (15%) and weapons offenses (5%). Compared to ten years ago, there has been some slight variation, with a greater percentage of arrests occurring in the violent, alcohol/drug, and weapon categories, and fewer in the property, “other,” and status categories.

Fewer adult arrests were alcohol/drug-related in 2016, compared to 2007

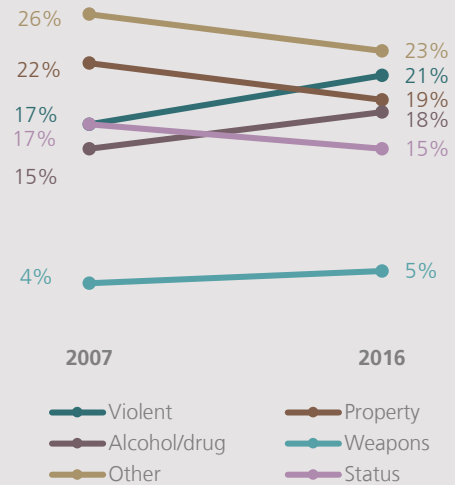

Juvenile arrests more evenly distributed across categories, compared to adults, in both 2007 and 2016



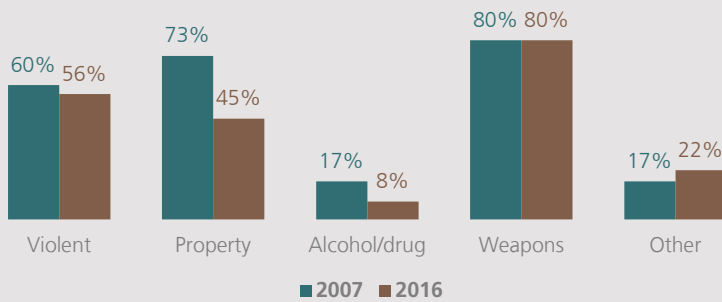

There also was variation across the arrest categories in terms of what percent represented offenses at the felony versus misdemeanor level for adults and juveniles, and these proportions varied over time. As Figure 8A shows, in 2007, 73 percent of property arrests of adults were at the felony level, a rate which decreased to 45 percent in 2016. Similarly, the proportion of alcohol/drug-related offenses at the felony level decreased from 17 percent to 8 percent. For juveniles, there were fewer arrests at the felony level in each category, with the exception of alcohol/drug (Figure 8B).

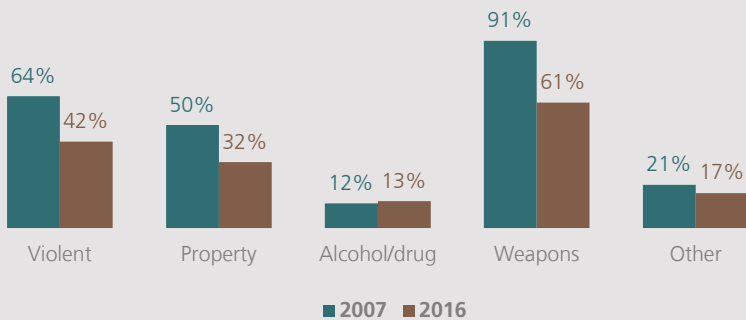
Fewer adult property and alcohol/drug-related arrests at the felony level in 2016 than 2007

Fewer juvenile arrests at the felony level in 2016 than 2007 for every category but alcohol/drug



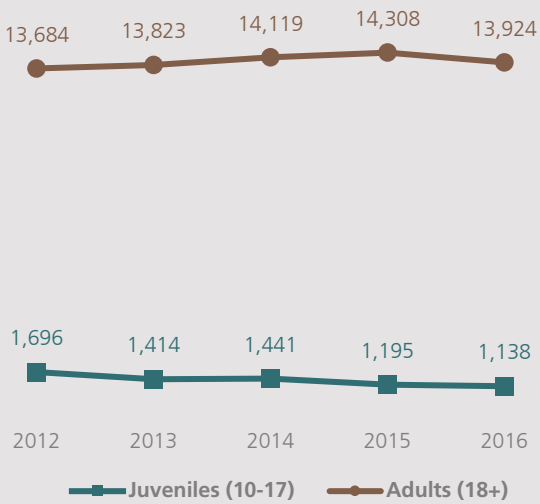

Violent offenses

The violent offense arrest category includes four felony-level offenses: homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault; and misdemeanor-level manslaughter/assault and battery. There were 13,924 adult and 1,138 juvenile arrests for violent offenses in 2016 (Figure 9). Arrests for a violent offense decreased 3 percent over the past year for adults, after three consecutive increases (Table 20). For juveniles, there was a 5 percent decrease from 2015 to 2016, marking a five-year low (Table 33).

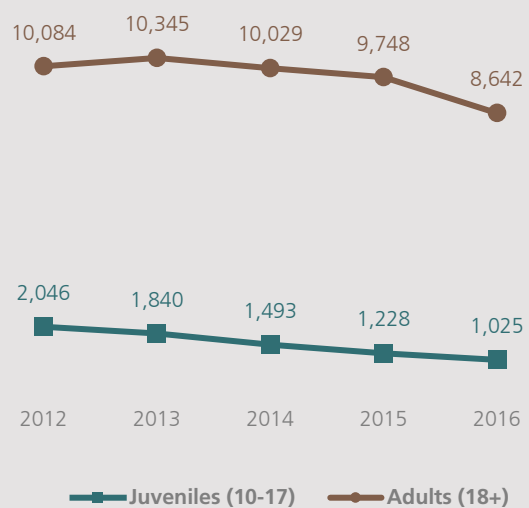
For adults, there were one-year decreases in each of the violent categories (Table 21). For juveniles, there was an increase in the number of robberies (12%), but a decrease in the number of felony-level aggravated assaults (-19%), and a slight decrease in the number of arrests for misdemeanor manslaughter/assault and battery (<-1%) (numbers were too small to compare for homicide and rape) (Table 34).

Property offenses

Property offenses include felony-level burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and misdemeanor-level petty theft/burglary. In 2016, there were 8,642 adult arrests for a property offense, which represented an eleven percent decrease from 2015, and a five-year low (Figure 10 and Table 20). For juveniles, the number of arrests for a property crime dropped to 1,025, a one-year decrease of 17 percent from 2015, and also a five-year low (Table 33).

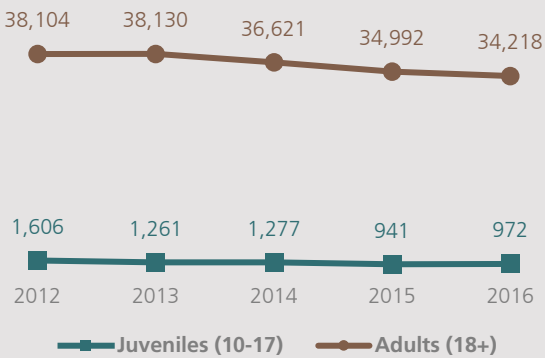
Despite an overall decrease in the number of adult arrests for property offenses, there was actually an increase in all three felony-level offense categories (11% burglary, 10% larceny, and 35% motor vehicle theft), with the overall drop driven by a 26 percent decrease in misdemeanor offenses (Table 22). For juveniles, there were decreases in two of the three felony-level offenses (-17% larceny and -11% motor vehicle theft), but a 3 percent increase for burglary. The number of arrests for misdemeanor petty theft/burglary also showed a significant drop from 2015 to 2016 (-21%) (Table 35).

Alcohol/drug-related offenses

In 2016, there were 34,218 adult and 972 juvenile arrests for alcohol/drug-related offenses (Figure 11). For adults, this represented a decrease of 2 percent from 2015, a five-year low. For juveniles it was an increase of 3 percent (Tables 20 and 33).

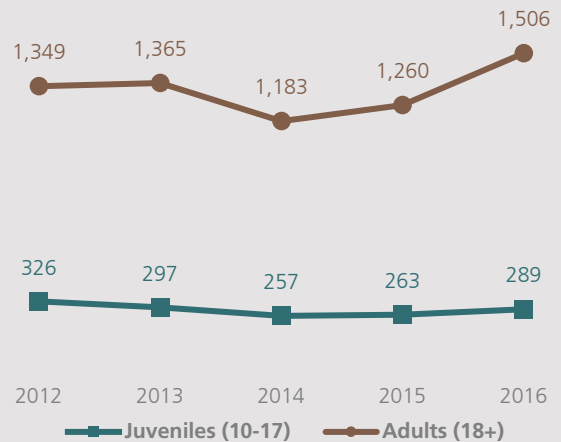
Within the alcohol/drug-related offense category are five felony and five misdemeanor categories. For adults, there were one-year declines for three of the five felony categories, ranging from 12 percent for narcotics (which includes heroin and morphine) to 30 percent for marijuana; the overall decrease for the felony-level offenses was 15 percent. The two exceptions for adults in the felony category was driving under the influence arrests, which increased 6 percent, and other drug offenses (which includes illegal prescription drugs), which increased 12 percent. At the misdemeanor level, all but one category had one-year decreases (ranging from -2% for marijuana to -30% for liquor laws). The one exception was other drug offenses (which increased 18%) (Table 23). For juveniles, there were increases in three of the five alcohol/drug-related charges (with enough numbers for comparison), which ranged from 12 percent for felony-level marijuana to 37 percent for misdemeanor other drug offenses. For the other two, misdemeanor drunk and liquor laws, the decreases were 33 percent and 22 percent, respectively (Table 36).

Weapons offenses

There were 1,506 adult arrests and 289 juvenile arrests for weapons violations in 2016 (Figure 12), representing a 20 percent increase for adults and a 10 percent increase for juveniles over the past year (Tables 20 and 33).

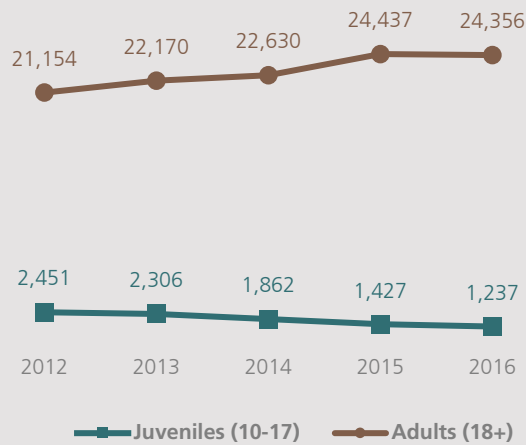
For adults, arrests for felony-level weapon offenses were up 22 percent and misdemeanors were up 12 percent (Table 24). For juveniles, there was a decrease of 17 percent for felony-level offenses, but an increase of 120 percent (51 to 112) for misdemeanor-offenses (Table 37).

Other offenses

There were 24,356 adult arrests and 1,237 juvenile arrests for "other" offenses in 2016 (Figure 13). At the felony level, "other" charges include sex-related offenses, forgery, and arson, as well as other felonies (such as kidnapping). At the misdemeanor level, offense types include other theft-related charges, sex-related and prostitution, disturbing the peace, vandalism/graffiti, hit-and-run, selected traffic offenses, violations of city/county ordinances, failure to appear in court offenses, and other charges such as contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Over the past year, there was a slight decrease (<-1%) in other offense arrests for adults and a 13 percent decrease for juveniles (Tables 20 and 33).

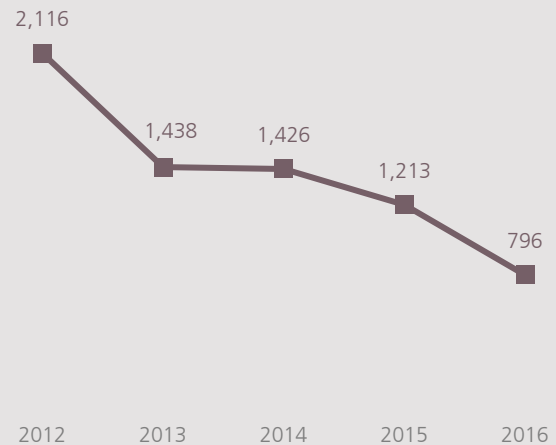
For adults, eight “other” categories were down (2 felony and 6 misdemeanor) and six were up (2 felony and 4 misdemeanor) (Table 25). The largest one-year decreases were in the categories of misdemeanor other theft/checks/access cards (-42%) and prostitution (-29%) and the largest increases were related to failure to appear (14%) and felony-level forgery (11%). For juveniles, there were decreases in four of the six categories with numbers large enough to compare, and increases for the other two. The largest decrease was a 39 percent one-year decline for misdemeanor vandalism/graffiti and the largest increase was 36 percent for misdemeanor sex-related (Table 38).

Status offenses

As Figure 14 shows, there were 796 status offense arrests in 2016, which represented a 34 percent decrease from 2015. Arrests for curfew violations dropped by 39 percent (Table 39).

Summary

The current CJ Bulletin describes what types of arrests were made in the San Diego region in 2016 by local law enforcement agencies of both adults and juveniles. In 2016, San Diego County had the second highest adult and juvenile arrest rates, compared to the other most populated counties in the State. For adults, the most noteworthy changes included increases in felony-level property crime arrests, but decreases in the misdemeanors. The juvenile arrest rate continued its pattern of decline, with drops for felonies, misdemeanors, as well as status offenses. The two exceptions were for weapon-related offenses, which also increased for adults, and alcohol/drug offenses.
